CONDITIONS OF ENTRY FOR THE ESA SHOW HORSE OF THE YEAR:

TO BE READ IN CONJUNCTION WITH THE NATIONAL RULES FOR THE CONDUCT OF STATE HORSE OF THE YEAR AND RIDING CHAMPIONSHIPS (found at the end of schedule)

- ENTRIES must be on the Official Entry Form, **with one horse and or rider per form**, photocopied forms accepted. Entries must be accompanied by the appropriate entry fee.

Entries close at 4.00pm on Friday 14 AUGUST 2009 at the ESA Inc Office at 6 Frederick Street, Richmond (Postal Address: PO Box 1177, MARLESTON, SA, 5033). Entries can be faxed with credit card details to 8234 2672. Any faxed entries without accurate credit card details won't be accepted. A fee of 1.8% is added to credit card payments to cover extra bank charges.

LATE ENTRIES WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED.

- The Organising Committee reserves the right to:-
 - alter or modify conditions or cancel the event;
 - withhold any prize or cancel any or all classes because of insufficient entries;
 - refuse entry in any class without stating a reason;
 - ballot any entry from the Event.
- DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY: Neither ESA Inc. or the Adelaide Showgrounds or the Royal Agricultural Society of South Australia accept liability for any accident, damage, injury or illness caused to owners, riders, horses, spectators or any person or property whatsoever.
- QUALIFICATION:** No qualifications required for any event
- Any Interstate EA Registered horse, which has been transferred/leased to SA within the 6 months prior to 30th October 2009, will **NOT** be eligible to enter the ESA Show Horse of the Year, ESA Show Hunter of the Year and Leading Rein classes.
- Horses entered in the 2009 South Australian Show Horse of the Year must, as a minimum, be jointly owned by a current member of ESA Inc. In the case of a joint ownership with a South Australian Owner, an interstate owner must be a current member of the relevant interstate Branch.
- All horses entered in the 2009 South Australian Show Horse of the Year **must have a nominated Rider or entries will not be accepted. Leading Rein Leaders and Riders are to be current financial ESA members at the time of entering. Leaders are to be over 18 years of age.**
- The Judges reserve the right to call all horses back for a decision to be reached.
- All finalists must be mounted at the Presentation Ceremony with all riders/handlers and horses in competition attire. Those not complying will not be permitted to enter the arena.
- The winners and runners up of the Small Pony, Large Pony, Galloway, Small and Large Show Horse, Leading Rein, Show Hunter Small Pony, Show Hunter Large Pony, Show Hunter Galloway, Show Hunter Hack, the Junior, Intermediate and Senior Champion Rider classes of the 2009 South Australian Show Horse of the Year will be eligible to be invited to represent South Australia in the 2009 Australian Show Horse Championships. The 3rd place getter will be automatically nominated in case either the Champion or Reserve be unable to attend the Australian Championships. It is expected that winners and the runners will be available to attend the Australian Championships.
- All general FEI, EA and EA By Laws and Rules apply to this event.**
- HEIGHT CERTIFICATES: All exhibits (including ponies in the Leading Rein) must have a current ESA Measuring Certificate issued by an official measurer on behalf of the ESA Inc. The Height Certificate Number must be included on the entry form. Should the Height Certificate Number not be available at the time of entry - the measuring certificate must be presented at the Secretary's Office before numbers will be issued.
- Protective headgear – ALL COMPETITORS** must wear an approved helmet at all times. Approved helmets must be Current Australian Standard AS/NZ 3838, Current European Standard EN 1384, or Current US Standard ASTN F1163.
- Swabbing levy is to be paid only **once per horse**, this includes rider class horses only entered for rider class events.
- All horses entered in the Horse of the Year show must be ESA Registered and have a current ESA height certificate relative for the height class to compete.
- A horse can only enter and compete in either a Show Horse or a Show Hunter event.
- Horses may not swap classes after entries have closed unless there is a height change.
- Horses may not be substituted for another horse.
- No prize money will be issued until the results of drug test swabs have been returned.
- Graduate Garland eligibility:** For horses which have not won an individual ridden Show Horse/ Hunter event at a Royal show, or an Australian Show Horse Championship or Grand National qualifying event at ESA HOY, Competitors' Assoc., or SHC Shows. Winners of the Aust. Show Horse Championships and Grand National Championships are also ineligible. (Leading Rein winners are eligible).
- In the event you are unable to attend the 2009 Australian Show Horse Championships you are required to advise the Chairperson immediately (or in suitable time) so to allow for another representative of the state to be sent.

NOTES FOR COMPETITORS

1. All events will be drawn. In the event of multiple rides you will be required to compete first on the horse which has been drawn last.
2. A competitor may ride more than one horse in a single event; however all entries must be mounted for presentation. An alternative rider must also be available if horses are required to present on the circle together.
3. If anyone has a clash of classes, please advise the ring stewards immediately.
4. Show Hunters finalists shall do a free workout, time limit to be 2.0 minutes. The workout must include gallop.
5. Show Horses finalists shall do a free workout, time limit to be 2.0 minutes.
6. Leading Rein Workout – standard Welsh/Riding Pony workout.
7. Set workout will be provided for rider class, newcomer and owner rider events.
8. **Swabbing** will occur.
9. The ESA reserves the right to vary these notices as required and without prior notice to competitors.
10. Newcomers must make sure their application is completed and lodged together with \$22 nomination fee by August 14 2009, see Newcomer Conditions p10.
11. **Ages of riders to be as of Friday 30th October 2009**
12. Details pertaining to the arrival and departure, working facilities and timetable etc will be provided with draw
13. Measuring will be available for country competitors ONLY, on Friday 30/10/09 from 8am for ½ an hour.
14. No refunds on entries will be given under any circumstances after close of entries 4pm Friday 14th August 2009.
15. All Australian championship qualifying events will be judged under the national point preferential scheme as stated in the EA National show horse rules.

State Horse of the Year and Riding Championship rules

Effective as of 1st January 2008

These rules are to be adhered to by the State Organising Committees in the conduct of State Horse of the Year and Riding Championships and only refer to those classes that qualify horses/riders for the Australian Show Horse Championships. States are still able to include additional conditions to the conduct of their State event that are State-specific and not in contradiction to these rules.

- 2.1 The event is to be conducted under the rules and by-laws of the EA.
- 2.2 Horses must be registered with the Equestrian Australia Ltd.
- 2.3 Show Horse, Show Hunter and Leading Rein Classes - All horses must have a current EA Height Certificate.
- 2.4 Rider of the Year Classes - Riders may only compete in the class for which they are eligible. Age is at the day of the event.
- 2.5 Show Horse, Show Hunter, Leading Rein and Rider of the Year Classes - All riders must be members of the EA in the State in which the event is being held.
- 2.6 Show Horse, Show Hunter and Leading Rein Classes - Horses/Ponies must be currently EA-registered and domiciled in that State (including where appropriate within a 100 km radius of a border) for a total period of 6 months immediately preceding the date of that State's Horse of the Year event. Due to climatic conditions and to ensure the welfare of the horses this period is reduced to 3 months in the NT. However, if the horse has not competed under saddle (with the exception of horse racing) in any state prior to purchase and is registered and eligible/qualified in the state in which it is to compete by closing date of entries it shall be eligible to compete in that respective state's HOTY
- 2.7 Show Horse, Show Hunter and Leading Rein Classes – Horse/Pony must be 3 years of age or over at 1 August.
- 2.8 Show Horse, Show Hunter and Leading Rein - If a horse has competed in a qualifying class at an EA HOTY in the current year in another State it is not eligible to compete in another HOTY in the same year.
- Rider Classes - If a rider has competed in an EA HOTY in the current year in a qualifying class in another State they are not eligible to compete in another HOTY in the same year.

- 2.10 Random swabbing will take place in accordance with the EA Medication Control Policy.
- 2.11 Judges must be selected from the EA Show Horse Judges List.
- 2.12 The Judges' decision is final.
- 2.13 The Organising Committee has the right to refuse any entry without having to assign any reasons.
- 2.14 Only the winner or the runner-up from state qualifying events are eligible to compete at the Australian Show Horse Championships, unless special dispensation is granted by the National Show Horse Committee upon written application from a state branch. The National Show Horse Committee will not consider applications for horses/ponies/riders placed lower than 3rd place at their State HOTY.
- 2.15 As a minimum a winner and runner-up is to be sashed and both announced at the event.
- 2.16 In qualifying Show Horse, Show Hunter and Rider classes three judges must be used as per the preferential judging system in 5.7 (excluding Northern Territory due to geographic isolation)
- 2.17 All qualifying events for the Australian Show Horse Championships (ie: State HOTYs) must be run by the State's Show Horse Committee (who may form or co-opt an organising sub-committee)
- 2.18 Results of winners and runners-up, and the names of all Finalists (top 10) to be sent to the relevant EA State Branch Office.

SA Show Horse Newcomer Rules

As of 17 June 2008

- ❑ Nomination forms can be downloaded from <http://www.sa.equestrian.org.au/> and must be submitted not later than the extended deadline of 4pm Friday 15th August 2008. Nomination fee must accompany form.
- ❑ A horse or pony shall be deemed a Newcomer if it has not been exhibited at any show or competition **under saddle in any discipline*** before the preceding 1st November 2008. (*includes but is not limited to show jumping, dressage, eventing, novelties, affiliated and unaffiliated classes).
- ❑ **The newcomer Show Horse and Hunter events are an incentive scheme for young horses starting out under saddle in their first season to compete on a level playing field. The nomination fee is \$22. \$20- of which will be pooled as a sweepstakes to be won at the newcomer class at that years' Horse of the Year Show. The monies will be divided as follows – winner 65%, second 25%, and third 10%. There will not be a further entry fee for the class at the horse of the year show.**
- ❑ Newcomers must not have been competing under saddle before 1st November 2008.
- ❑ Nominations close 4pm, 14 August 2009.
- ❑ Applications to obtain newcomer certification can be made to the ESA saddle horse committee at any time throughout the year. The application form and statutory declaration agreeing to the rules and regulations as set out by the ESA saddle horse committee must be signed. This forms a legally binding document.
- ❑ There is no restriction on newcomers horses being shown in the open ring at the Horse of the Year Show or any other shows during the year.
- ❑ A horse or pony may only be able to compete in the ESA horse of the year newcomer class once.
- ❑ The EA horse minimum age limit applies (3 years). 1st of August is taken as the common birthday for all horses.
- ❑ Each month, the saddle horse committee will review applications for newcomer horses.
- ❑ Ponies in the 12.2 and under class must be ridden by a child 14 or under, as in the open class.
- ❑ Genuine scratchings must be officially notified to receive a refund and possibly be re-eligible for the newcomer class the next year if the horse has not been shown before the 1st of November 2009.
- ❑ Horses are to be ridden in a snaffle bridle.

Conditions of entry for Owner Rider classes

As of 17 June 2008

- ❑ Owner-Riders must be members of the ESA. Horses must be registered with the ESA.
- ❑ All horses and ponies to be the bona fide property of the rider or the rider's immediate family, (i.e. mother, father, sister, brother of RIDER).
- ❑ Horses and ponies may not be owned in partnership unless with immediate family (see definition above).
- ❑ Owner-Riders may be required to provide a statutory declaration to prove eligibility.
- ❑ Any protests regarding eligibility must be lodged in writing to the secretary on the day of the event.

Australian Show Horse and Riding Championship rules

Effective as of 1st January 2008

- 3.1 Horses must be registered with, and riders and owners members of, Equestrian Australia Ltd.
- 3.2 All horses in the Show Horse, Show Hunter and Leading Rein Classes are required to have a current EA Height Certificate at the time of competing in their State event and the Australian event.
- 3.3 The selection of State representatives will be the sole responsibility of the State Branch concerned. The winner and runner-up from state qualifying events are eligible to compete at the Australian Show Horse Championships, unless special dispensation is granted by the EA Show Horse Committee upon written application from a state branch. The EA Show Horse Committee will not consider applications for horses/ponies/riders placed lower than 3rd place at their State HOTY.
- 3.4 A horse will not be disqualified from representing the state in which it qualified, as a result of a change of ownership or lease. If a horse is sold or leased to another State it is no longer eligible to represent the State in which it won.
- 3.5 A horse which has qualified to represent a State at an Australian Championship may not compete in any other State's qualifying competition in the period leading up to the Australian championships concerned.
- 3.6 A horse competing in the Show Horse, Show Hunter and Leading Rein Classes must be ridden by a member from the State or Territory that the horse is representing.
- 3.7 The panel of judges will not contain more than **one** judge from any one State. Three judges are to be selected from the EA Show Horse Judges List. States may put forward names and resumés to the EA Show Horse Committee by 1 June each year. It is recommended that state committees hold a secret ballot to select their choices. A judge must not have judged a State Horse of the Year event in the current year.

A maximum of 3 names are to be submitted by each state/delegate. All names chosen by the states go in the hat, a name may go in the hat more than once if more than one state has chosen that judge, all names are drawn until no more names remain, so there is an ordered list of Judges from which to make the invitations/appointments. There will only be one judge invited from any state, which will be the first judge from that state drawn from the hat.

- 3.8 The Australian Championship Competitions will be as follows:

- 3.9 Trans Tasman. A New Zealand team made up of winners or runners-up (if the winner is unable to attend) from the NZ HOY is invited by the EA Show Horse Committee to compete in the aligned Australian age and height categories. Those eligible for the Trans-Tasman competition are the small and large ponies, galloway and hack for Show Horse and Show Hunter classes as well as Junior, Intermediate and Senior riders. This competition is held under the EA Show Horse Rules.
- 3.10 Note in relation to rider ages: The age of the rider is the age at the qualifying event.
- 3.11 Workouts must be provided to all competitors at least 24 hours prior to the competition.
- 3.12 The order of starting for each competition will be decided by ballot for each section, which must be carried out in the presence of the owners and/or team managers.
- 3.13 All horses competing at the Australian Show Horse Championships are eligible to be swabbed as per the National Medication Control Policy.
- 3.14 The Championships are to be conducted during the months of October, November or December each year, unless decided otherwise by the EA Show Horse Committee.
- 3.15 A Runner-Up will be awarded in each class.
- 3.16 Results of winners, runners-up, and of all Finalists (top 10) to be sent to the EA State Branch Office.
