J/YR Novice Champion (2:2 & 2:3) ~ Wyebo Skylark Trophy. J/YR Elementary Champion (3:2 & 3:3) ~ Jackman & Treloar Trophy.

The selection of Preliminary, Novice, Elementary, Medium, Advanced and FEI Champions will be made using the ranking points system- see EA Rule 8.9. Place-getters in each event will be allotted points for their placing – eg 30 for first, 29 for second etc. The total number of points at each level for each horse will be added and the horse with the highest number of points will become the Champion for Preliminary, Novice, Elementary, Medium, Advanced and FEI. Where there is an equality of points, the Champion will be the horse with the highest aggregate percentage at that level. To be the FEI Champion, the horse must compete in two FEI classes and the appropriate Freestyle for its level (see starting possibilities rule 1.15.3).

\*Note: for horses competing at Medium Tour in Intermediate A and B, only Intermediate B results will count towards the FEI Champion.

The selection of the Junior / Young Rider Champion (riders competing in Classes 5, 10, 15, 20 25) will be made by combining the performances of two consecutive level classes (either Preliminary and Novice or Novice and Elementary etc) and using the ranking points system as per EA Rule 8.9. Where there is an equality of points, the Championship will be decided according to the highest aggregate percentage.

The selection of the Pony Champion (competing in Classes 1, 6, 11, 16, 21) will be made by combining the performances of two consecutive level classes (either Preliminary and Novice or Novice and Elementary etc) and using the ranking points system as per EA Rule 8.9. Where there is an equality of points, the Championship will be decided according to the highest aggregate percentage.

The selection of Amateur Owner-Rider Champions at Preliminary, Novice, Elementary, Medium, and Advanced will be made using a separate ranking points system for declared AOR in each competition, using as a guide EA Rule 8.9. AOR ranking in each event will be allotted points for their placing – eg 30 for first AOR, 29 for second AOR etc. The total number of points at each level for each horse will be added and the horse with the highest number of points will become the AOR Champion for Preliminary, Novice, Elementary, Medium, and Advanced. Where there is an equality of points, the Champion will be the horse with the highest aggregate percentage at that level. (Note: no AOR awards for EA Freestyle). The FEI AOR Champion will be based on the Aggregate of two FEI levels **AND** appropriate Freestyle, using the same points system. To be the AOR FEI Champion, the horse must compete in two FEI classes and the appropriate Freestyle for its level (see starting possibilities rule 1.15.3).

Team events: The scores used are taken from the Preliminary I:3, Novice 2:3, Elementary 3:3 for the EA Team and the Medium 4:3, Advanced 5:3, PSG for the EA-FEI Team. The winning EA Team and EA-FEI team is the one having the highest total percentage score, the second is the team with the next highest total percentage and so on. Refer to EA Rule 8.6.2.

#### **CONDITIONS OF ENTRY**

- 1. **RULES:** Equestrian SA will conduct the 2015 South Australian Dressage Championships under the auspices of Equestrian Australia (EA) in strict accordance with EA National Dressage Rules for Official Competitions (1 February 2015, as amended) and FEI Rules for Dressage Events.
- 2. (a) **Riders** taking part in the Competition must be financial members of EA and be 12 years or over on the day of competition (or at least ten years old if riding a pony).
  - (b) **Horses and ponies** in the competition must be registered with EA, have a current Competition Licence (formerly Performance Card) (Dressage or Pony Dressage) and be owned by a financial member of EA. All horses and ponies may compete at only two (2) consecutive levels. Pony Dressage is available at the described levels.
- 3. SWABBING: Random swabbing will take place as required by the EA National Dressage Rules governing State Championship events and in accordance with the FEI Veterinary Rules, subject to any amendment or inclusions as at 17 April 2015. Please make yourself aware of prohibited substances and the relevant withdrawal period. Check the ingredients of all products you are using including herbal products with your vet. Security and access to the horse is the sole responsibility of the owner/rider.
- 4. ALL TESTS are as per current EA tests introduced 01/01/2014, or current FEI tests (revised 01/01/2014). No test may be commanded.
- 5. **HC:** Horses and ponies may NOT compete Hors Concours at this competition.
- 6. **ENTRY FORMS** must be correctly and fully completed. All competitors are strongly encouraged to submit their entries via Nominate and pay fees by electronic funds transfer. A Postal Entry Handling Fee of \$30 will be charged for entries and cheques sent by post to the ESA Office (fees must accompany these entry forms). Any errors and omissions may result in the entry being rejected. Entries close on **Monday, 2<sup>nd</sup> March 2015, close of business. NO LATE ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED**.
- 7. COMPETITION LICENCES: A photocopy of both sides of each horse's current Competition Licence (formerly performance card) must accompany entries. Competition performances must be recorded. ENTRIES WILL NOT be accepted unless this is included. HC performances used as qualification must also be recorded or a copy of the relevant test included with entries.
- 8. **HORSES** in EA and FEI classes must exceed 149 cms with shoes or 148 cms without shoes. Riders of ponies, please be aware of any rule changes in 2015 in regard to height measurement and certificates. EA Rules will be applied.
- 9. **LEVELS:** Any horse may compete in two consecutive levels only and a maximum of three tests per day within the levels (which may include a freestyle) at EA Level and a maximum of two tests per day (which may include a freestyle) at FEI Level. The Medium Tour level is a separate level between Intermediate I and Intermediate II. For the purpose of entries at these levels the possible combinations are: Inter I and Medium Tour OR Medium Tour and Inter II. If entering an FEI Freestyle class (Inter I, Medium Tour or GP) it must be the correct level for the combination.
- 10. **NUMBER OF HORSES PER RIDER:** No rider may ride more than 2 horses in any competition. For riders with multiple horses entered in the event, the OC will make every effort for a draw which gives sufficient time between rides but this may not always be guaranteed.
- 11. **REFUNDS**: A full refund of fees will be given for entries not accepted or balloted out. Once an entry is accepted, the Admin/Grounds Fee is non-refundable. **DEPOSITS** (Freestyle) will be refunded after each horse has completed its test or is scratched before 12.00 noon on Thursday 16 April 2015. **ENTRY FEES** fifty percent (50%) of entry fees less the Admin/Grounds fee will be refunded upon receipt of a Veterinary Certificate or Medical Certificate, which must be presented to the OC no later than two days after the event. If a horse is on a reserve list and does not compete in that event, or has to scratch and is replaced by a reserve, then all (100%) of the entry fee for that event will be refunded.
- 12. **BRIDLE NUMBERS** must be worn with one on each side of the horse (bridle or saddle blanket); they are the responsibility of the competitor to provide. The SA Bridle number system will apply.
- 13. **PRIZE MONEY:** Winners and placegetters in all classes will be presented with ribbons or rosettes to a maximum of 8<sup>th</sup> place (depending on entries) and prizemoney and/or vouchers and/or product of equivalent or greater value, to 3<sup>rd</sup> place. Presentations will be unmounted but competitors must be in full competition attire. **Failure to comply will result in withdrawal of prizes and prizemoney.**
- 14. **PROTESTS** must be lodged in writing, together with a \$50.00 deposit, no later than 30 minutes after the incident which gives rise to the dispute. The deposit will be refunded only if the protest is upheld.
- 15. **TEST SHEETS** can be collected from the Secretary's Office once all results for the competition have been officially posted.
- 16. **FREESTYLE TESTS** must be ridden to music. CD's must be lodged with the secretary **ONE HOUR PRIOR TO THE START OF THE EVENT**. A horse may enter only one freestyle event. A freestyle bond of \$25.00 is included as a part of your entry for the freestyle tests. After completion of your test and following the competition you will be sent a refund of the freestyle bond. It is advised that riders supply two (2) copies on different brands of CDs in case of malfunction. Competitors should arrange to check their music with the producer by mutual arrangement, in the time preceding the event on Sunday 19th April.
- 17. **JUNIOR/YOUNG RIDER COMPETITION.** A combined group, open to riders who are 12 years and over up to the end of the year in which they turn 21. Juniors and Young Riders will compete together. Horses must be registered with EA. Riders must nominate to compete **either** as Junior (12-18 years) or Young Rider (16 21 years). Young Riders may compete in both Young Rider events and Official Open competition, but cannot ride more than three tests per day. Juniors and YR can compete in both Young Rider events and Pony events but cannot ride more than three tests per day. Qualifications will be required.
- 18. **OPEN RIDERS** must be 14 years of age and over on the day of the competition (Junior & Young Rider Classes see 17). Current EA membership is mandatory. The horse/pony must have obtained qualifications in official competition at the level entered (see qualifications).
- 19. PONY COMPETITION. Run as per 2015 EA Rules with separate classes. Qualifications will be required.
- 20. **MINIMUM NUMBERS:** The Committee reserves the right to withdraw prize-money from classes with insufficient starters, at their discretion. All effort will be made to run classes with three or less horses, and award rosettes, but prizes are not guaranteed.
- 21. **BALLOTING OF ENTRIES**: There will be a limit of 35 horses per event with six reserves and one division only in all classes. Where more than 35 entries are received balloting will occur. Balloting will be based on the average of the highest percentages of three tests at the particular level, back twelve months from the date of close of entries. The 35 highest average percentages will be accepted in each event. Horses with three performances will be considered ahead of those who have two or only one performance percentages. An HC performance will be considered to be a qualification, but will be balloted as above.

- 22. **AMATEUR OWNER RIDERS:** to be indicated on entry forms, for separate ranking of places. AOR as defined by EA criteria. AOR rankings will apply to Preliminary, Novice, Elementary, Medium and Advanced. For FEI there will be a combined champion, based on the aggregate of two FEI levels **AND** appropriate Freestyle.
- 23. **THE DRAW**: Will be available via the Equestrian South Australia website. Will be strictly adhered to and riders **must** present to **THE MARSHALL** 15 minutes prior to their specified times. Failure to present to the judge at the correct time may incur elimination.
- 24. **GEAR STEWARD: EA, Pony, Junior** and **Young Rider** competitors must present to the Gear Steward prior to each test. **FEI** competitors will be gear checked either before their test or at the conclusion of their test (at the rider's discretion), and prior to leaving the marshalling area. **FAILURE TO DO SO SHALL INCUR ELIMINATION**.
- 25. **ARENA FAMILIARISATION**: During each morning of Friday, Saturday and Sunday a time will be made available for arena familiarization before competition starts. These times will be listed in the draw. Work at walk, trot and canter will be allowed but only **OUTSIDE** the arenas. Any horse led in hand must be in a bridle (with number).
- 26. **LUNGING**: Lunging will only be allowed in designated fenced area on the north-eastern side of the grounds.
- 27. SCRATCHINGS: Must be given to the Equestrian South Australia Office by 12.00 noon Thursday, 16 April 2015 (08) 8391 0488.
- 28. **PROTECTIVE HEADGEAR** please refer to the Equestrian Australia Rules for Dressage (2015, as amended).
- 29. **LIABILITY:** NEITHER THE ORGANISING COMMITTEE, EA NOR THE OWNERS/LESSEES OF THE VENUE ACCEPT ANY LIABILITY FOR ACCIDENT, DAMAGE, INJURY OR ILLNESS TO HORSES, OWNERS, RIDERS, SPECTATORS, PERSONS OR PROPERTY WHATSOEVER.

PRELIMINARY Must have obtained 60% or more of the total possible marks at Competitive Preliminary level in the 12 months prior to

close of entries (Monday, 2 March 2015) and be graded Preliminary.

**NOVICE** Must have obtained 60% or more of the total possible marks at Competitive Novice level in the preceding 12 months

prior to close of entries (Monday, 2 March 2015) and be graded no higher than Novice level.

ELEMENTARY

Must have obtained 58% or more of the total possible marks at Competitive Elementary level in the preceding 12 months

prior to close of entries (Monday, 2 March 2015) and be graded no higher than Elementary level.

Must have obtained 58% or more of the total possible marks at Competitive Medium level in the preceding 12 months prior to close of entries (Monday, 2 March 2015) and be graded no higher than Medium level.

ADVANCED Must have obtained 58% or more of the total possible marks at Competitive Advanced level in the preceding 12 months

prior to close of entries (Monday, 2 March 2015) and be graded no higher than Advanced level.

## PRIX ST. GEORGES, INTERMEDIATE I, INTERMEDIATE A and B, INTERMEDIATE II & GRAND PRIX

Must have obtained 55% or more of the total possible marks at the relevant FEI level in the preceding I2 months prior to close of entries (Monday, 2 March 2015). (Note: for Intermediate B qualification, scores at Inter A count, and vice versa).

FREESTYLE Freestyle tests do not incur grading points. The Freestyle classes are unofficial competitions, with a combined EA

Freestyle group and a combined FEI Freestyle group. There is no qualifying score to reach in GP at the championships in

order to compete in the  $\operatorname{\mathsf{GP}}$  Freestyle.

JUNIOR/YOUNG RIDER See Condition 17. Must have obtained 55% or more of the total possible marks at the relevant level in the preceding 12

months prior to close of entries (Monday, 2 March 2015).

**PONIES** See Condition 19. Must have obtained 55% or more of the total possible marks at the relevant level in the preceding 12

months prior to close of entries (Monday, 2 March 2015).

YOUNG HORSE No qualifying percentage required. Must have competed at the relevant age group in the preceding 12 months prior to

close of entries (Monday, 2 March 2015).

## **HAVE I QUALIFIED?**

You need ONE performance at 60% for Preliminary or Novice, ONE performance at 58% for Elementary, Medium, Advanced and ONE performance at 55% at FEI to allow you to make an entry. If this is your <u>only</u> performance, it may be HC. Further performances are required for balloting purposes only. They do <u>not</u> have to be >55/58/60%, but must have been gained in Official Competitive competition.

**STABLING**: No stabling is available at the MCDC Grounds. Limited yards (12) are available and are suitable only as a tie up area, not for overnight stay. Yards can be taken on the day on a first-come, first-served basis. Yards must be cleaned before leaving and after inspection by a committee member to ensure this has been done, otherwise a further charge of \$20 to your entry fees will be incurred.
