About the Organisation

Equestrian South Australia (ESA) is the peak body for horse sports in South Australia and is the state body of Equestrian Australia, which is the controlling body for horse sports in Australia and is affiliated with the Federation Equestre Internationale (FEI), which is the controlling body for horse sports world-wide. Equestrian SA also maintains affiliations with relevant Government and Non-Government agencies at the State level.

Equestrian SA is a non-profit organisation incorporated under the Associations Incorporations Act of South Australia. It comprises of individual members, affiliated clubs, life members, coaches and Officials. Equestrian SA embraces the eight horse sports of:

- Carriage Driving (An International Sport)
- Dressage (An International and Olympic Sport)
- Eventing (An International and Olympic Sport)
- Show Horse (A National Sport)
- Show Jumping (An International and Olympic Sport)
- Vaulting (An International Sport).
- Interschool (A National School Sport)
- Para Equestrian (An International and Olympic Sport)

The primary objectives of Equestrian SA in accordance with its Constitution is to:-

- Create a uniform entity through and by which Equestrian in South Australia can be encouraged, conducted, promoted and administered and to be the governing body of Equestrian in South Australia;
- Promote and encourage Equestrian within South Australia and the conduct of Equestrian as an affiliated member of Equestrian Australia;
- Adopt and accept the rules of FEI and abide by the interpretation of such rules as determined from time to time by the Association;
- Act for its Members in all matters pertaining to Equestrian;
- Control, manage and conduct Equestrian competitions at a state level;
- Select and manage Equestrian teams to represent South Australia in national competitions inside and outside South Australia;
- Encourage, conduct, promote, and administer Equestrian throughout South Australia, in a fair and reasonable manner, through and by the Members for the mutual and collective benefit of the Members and Equestrian;
- Act in good faith and loyalty to ensure the maintenance and enhancement of the Association and Equestrian, its standards, quality and reputation for the collective and mutual benefit of the Members and Equestrian;

About the role

The ESA Board of Directors comprises up to 9 members with substantial business skills and expertise, drawn from the corporate, private, public and community sectors. The Board members work in a voluntary capacity to provide strategic oversight and governance in line with ESA's mission.

Due to a director's resignation, ESA is seeking to fill this vacancy. In addition to general director duties, we are seeking a director with specific education, coaching and officials skills to fulfil this role.

Applicants should be able to demonstrate effective communication skills and strong relationship building capabilities. Knowledge of the equestrian sector is an advantage but not a prerequisite. The Director will be expected to attend monthly board meetings, to be well prepared and add value to board dialogue as well as the ability to focus at the governance level of issues.

All board members are required to be paid members of ESA.
