BEFORE YOU START – SOME GENERAL NOTES TO HELP YOU ENJOY YOUR EVENTING!!

EA Eventing rules must be read in conjunction with FEI rules for all phases for all classes including lower levels .

In general FEI rules apply except for specific instances listed in EA rules.

It is suggested that riders keep up to date with FEI rules via the free FEI rule App which has rules for all disciplines . The FAQ link under Eventing in the App is excellent as there are clear photos showing gear that is allowed and not allowed !

What we all remember most however is Gill's enthusiasm and dedication as Director and Board member of the Australian International Three Day Event that saw that 4* Event take its rightful place amongst the very top events in the World, alongside Badminton & Burghley. Aus3DE will remain Gill's ongoing legacy to the Sport in our State. She will be missed.

GENERAL REGULATIONS FOR ALL HORSE TRIALS

The following regulations, which particularly concern competitors when making entries for Horse Trials, should be carefully noted. For any eventuality not covered in the rules, then the FEI Rules for Eventing Current Edition and FEI General Regulations Current Edition should be referred to.

REGISTRATION OF HORSES New regulations from 2014

EVA95 & ABOVE

All horses competing in **EvA95** and above classes must be micro chipped and registered with EA and have current EA Competition Licenses. They must be entered in their full registered name and their registered EA Number must be included. Horses must always carry identifying numbers when competing at events.

EVA50, EVA65 & EVA80

Horses competing in **EvA50**, **EvA65** and **EvA80** are not required to be registered. Full or base membership is encouraged but horses do not need to hold a current Competition License.

FEI REGISTRATION

All Horses and Riders competing in International Classes (CIC or CCI) must also be registered with the FEI.

COMPETITORS & OWNERS

EVA95 & ABOVE CLASSES

Riders competing in EvA95 and above must be Competitive Senior or Junior Members of their EA State Branch to compete.

Owners of all horses competing in Official classes, EvA95 and above, must be current members of their EA State Branch, minimum Supporter membership.

COMPETITORS & OWNERS

EVA50, EVA 65 & EVA80

Riders of horses in EvA50, EvA65 and EvA80 must be a minimum of a Participant Member of EA.

Organising Committees now include EvA50, EvA65 and EvA80 in their official schedules and they are conducted under EA Rules.

ENTRY FEES & LEVIES

The ESA Eventing Levy, currently \$13.00 per horse per entry, it is **NOT** built into entry fees and has to be added to entry fees for all classes.

Equine Anti-Doping and Controlled Medication Program (EADMCP) was introduced in 2016.

This Levy is **NOT** built into entry fees and has to be added to entry fees for **FEI Classes only**.

Each horse which is entered into an FEI event will incur the FEI's Worldwide Equine and Human Anti-Doping program fee, of which there are two cost tiers:

Each horse competing in a lower level* event will be charged CHF 18

Each horse competing in a higher level event will be charged CHF 25

**Refer to [page 48 of the FEI General Regulations](#) for a list of lower level events*

The FEI will invoice EA and EA will in turn recover the fees from the OC, in the same way that EA currently collects Organising Dues. EA will collect the amount in Australian dollars using the exchange rate on the day which the FEI invoices EA.

WITHDRAWING

If you fail to notify your withdrawal to the relevant Organising Committee you will be reported to the ESA who may impose a fine.

REFUNDS

As per the 2017 Eventing National Rules

Entry fees will be refunded in full (an administration fee of up to 10% may be deducted) to competitors who withdraw before the close of entries. There will be no refund of

entry fees for withdrawals after the close of entries. However, stabling/yard and camping fees will be refunded in full.

RIDING DOWN

Riding down one level from a higher level for which a horse is qualified carries no penalty.

Riding down 2 or more levels will incur 10 penalties, to be added to the total faults for the 3 phases. It is the responsibility of the competitor to inform the Organising Committee at the time of entry that they are riding down 2 or more levels.

QUALIFICATIONS

Full details of the rules for qualifications are available on the EA National Website.

However, for a horse and rider to move up a level from EvA105 to 3* and 4* they must achieve 3 qualifications (MERs) at each level (1* & 2*) as per the National Eventing Rule Book. MER refers to Minimum Eligibility Requirement.

NOTE New Rule applies for Junior and Young Riders under the age of 18 moving up to CNC/CIC1* and will be explained at the end of this General Regulations Section.

- All MERs must have a dressage score of not less than 55%
- All MERs may not have more than 75 seconds exceeding the optimum cross country time
- All MERs may not have more than 16 jumping faults
- Riders are responsible for ascertaining that their horse has correctly qualified for a class that they are entering
- Once a horse has qualified for a higher level, and has achieved one qualifying run at the higher level, it shall be

established at that (higher) level. Until it achieves that qualifying run, it shall remain established at the previous (lower) level.

A rider who is established to ride at CNC*** level, may enter a horse at CNC* level competitions without the horse having any previous qualifying results.

There will be an automatic penalty of \$100 for riders found to have incorrectly stated a horse qualification on an entry form. A rider unwilling to accept this automatic fine shall be subject to Disciplinary Procedures.

REVERSE QUALIFICATIONS

A reverse qualification is the obligation for a Horse to show restored competence at a lower level (MER) after a number of unsuccessful attempts at a certain level. Reverse Qualification only applies to the Horse.

A reverse qualification is triggered by two consecutive Cross Country eliminations within a 12 months rolling period of time in an international competition.

Reverse qualification also applies to National Levels EvA95, EvA105, CNC/CCN*, CNC/CCN** and CNC/CCN***.

Any MER that is required at the lower level before being allowed to compete again must be obtained as the combination that triggered the reverse qualification.

BREACH OF RULES

If a competitor is found guilty of a breach of the rules under the EA-FEI Code of Conduct and receives a penalty, that person will be ineligible to win any EA-SA Award in ANY discipline.

ELIMINATED COMPETITORS

Competitors must not continue to jump or attempt to jump, the same fence or further fences after being eliminated. A competitor

MUST WALK his horse off the course either mounted or unmounted. If you continue after elimination, disciplinary action will be taken.

NOTE EvA50 & EvA65 UPDATE XC REFUSALS:

1. 3 refusals/circles at the same fence on cross country means elimination for the combination. This now also applies to EvA50 & EvA65. It is NO LONGER permitted to bypass that fence in order to complete the course.
2. 4 refusals/circles at obstacles in total on the course entails elimination for the combination you MUST leave the course at a walk.

YELLOW WARNING CARD and OFFICIAL WARNING SYSTEM

A Yellow Warning Card or Official Warning may be issued by an EA Official (Technical Delegate, a member of the Ground Jury or Chief Steward) for offences of a less serious nature at Events.

SWABBING

Competitors are reminded that swabbing may occur at **ANY** competition, at any time.

The Control of Medication of Horses will be conducted in accordance with the General Regulations & Veterinary Regulations of the FEI.

RIDING BOOTS (Rule 538 1.4)

Boots worn during the Dressage and Jumping Tests (other than as part of regulation service dress) must be black, brown or black with a brown top. **EA 538.1.4 CNC/CCN Boots**

In all Tests, boots (other than as part of regulation service dress) must be black, brown or black with a brown top. They must either be long boots in one piece or a full grain smooth leather leg piece (on at least the exposed side of

the gaiter) and leather boot. Chapettes (suede) are not permitted. Juniors may compete in jodhpurs and short boots. For further detail: http://www.equestrian.org.au/sites/default/files/EA_National_Eventing_Rules_CLEANversion_01022018_2.pdf



HELMETS – NEW RULE AS AT 1ST JAN 2017

As per the EA General Regulations, Article 122.2: Dress and Salute, the following will apply:

Except where Sport Rules allows otherwise, riders and drivers competing in an EA competition, must wear an approved helmet with the chin strap fastened at all times. The same is recommended when riding a horse at any time.

Protective headgear must conform with one of the current approved safety standards:

- Current Australian standard **AS/NZS 3838** (2006 onwards) *provided they are SAI Global marked.*
- New Australian standard **ARB HS 2012** *provided they are SAI Global marked.*
- Current American standard **ASTM F1163** (2004a or 04a onwards) *provided they are SEI marked.*
- Current American standard **SNELL E2001.**
- Current British standard **PAS 015** (1998 or 2011) *provided they are BSI Kitemarked.*
- Interim European Standard **VG1** (01.040: 2014-12) *with or without BSI Kitemark.*

NOTES :

- On December 16, 2014, the European Union announced that the (BS)**EN1384** helmet certification standard would be withdrawn. EA decided to withdraw this certification from

the list of approved standards, starting on 1 January 2017.

- Helmet Manufacturers generally recommend replacing your helmet every 5 years or so.
- If you have a hard-blow impact accident while wearing your helmet, it is recommended to immediately replace it for a new model. There may be damage to the helmet that is not visible to the naked eye.
- It is the rider's responsibility to wear the approved standard.
- The club/organising committee's role is to take reasonable steps to ensure compliance with the rules by communicating the list of approved standards to their members/competitors when becoming a member or entering a competition.

LONG HAIR

If you have long hair please ensure it is tied up sufficiently so that it does not hang over your Body Number when going cross country. "Long hair must be tied up in a bun or hair net, no plaits or pony tails...this is now a rule".

GLOVES

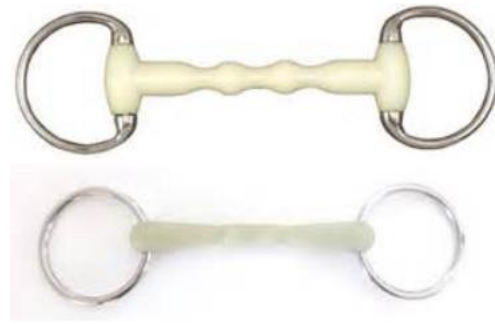
Gloves area optional at EvA105 and levels below.

WHIPS

It is forbidden to carry a whip of any kind when competing in the Dressage Arena. However, the use of one whip, with a total maximum length of 120cm, in the practice arena is allowed. The whip must be dropped before entering the space around the competition arena or the athlete will entail a penalty.

BITS

Please check your National EA and International FEI Rules for changes to legal bits. **Ribbed Happy bits are no longer permitted but smooth Happy bits are allowed.**



NOSEBANDS

Please ensure the tightness of the nose band complies with regulation that two fingers should fit comfortably under the nose band from the midpoint of the nose band.

SPURS

Spurs are optional for all three Tests. Spurs capable of wounding a Horse are forbidden. Spurs must be of smooth material (metal or plastic). If there is a shank it must not be more than four centimetres long (the overall shank must be measured from the boot to the end of the spur) and must point only towards the rear.

The end of the shank must be blunt to prevent wounding a Horse. If the shank is curved, the spurs must be worn only with the shank directed downwards. Metal or plastic spurs with round hard plastic or metal knobs "Impulse spurs" and "Dummy spurs" with no shank are allowed.

Rowel spurs are allowed only the Dressage and Jumping Tests and when practising/warming up for Dressage and Jumping. If they are used, rowels must be free to rotate and the rowel must be round and smooth (no times allowed).

SPONSORS

ESA request that riders receiving Trophies and/or Prizes and/or Prize Money donated by Sponsors write and acknowledge with gratitude the Sponsor's support of Horse Trials in this State. Riders are requested not have a rug on their horse with any logo of their personal sponsor (or any logo that is not one of the event

sponsors) Best to dress horse in a plain rug for presentations!

UNFIT HORSES

Many Committees and supporters of Horse Trials are concerned about the number of rodents pushing unfit horses at competitions, especially on cross country. Both the Appeals Committee and the Technical Delegate can eliminate a competitor contravening the rules.

CLEANLINESS OF PROPERTY

As most Horse Trials are held on private property, competitors MUST endeavour to leave the horse parking area clear of all rubbish including INSULATING TAPE used to tape bandages and boots. Please keep venues clean so property owners continue to support our sport!

DOGS

Dogs should preferably be left at home. If competitors take dogs to competitions then the dogs must be tied up or kept on a lead AT ALL TIMES.

Some Organising Committees do not allow dogs at their venues. Please check individual schedules.

FALLS

Any falls on competition site must be checked by the doctor prior to resuming competing and/or leaving grounds. See rule 523.3 for clarification.

DRESSAGE TESTS

Brief Notes regarding Dressage Judging for Eventing:

- Half marks will be used in all Eventing Dressage from 1st January 2015 (544.1)
- Carrying whips around arena -2 marks (FEI Dressage Art 430 6.2) Carrying whip in the arena -2 marks

- (FEI Dressage Art 30 6.2) Judge must ring the bell and ask rider to drop the whip as soon as noticed.
- Fly bonnets (allowed outdoors only – no noise cancelling material) (FEI 538.2.3)
- Falls in Dressage arena entails elimination.
- Leaving the arena during the test entails elimination.
- Spurs are optional for all tests and levels.

AMBULANCE COVER

It is recommended that ALL riders be members of the Ambulance Service. If you are not a Member and require transport to Hospital in a civil Ambulance you will be required to pay for it yourself.

RULE CHANGES TO EVA50 & EVA65

Effective 1st January 2017, EvA50, EvA65 will be run under the National Rules as per EvA80 and above.

RULE CHANGE – PLEASE NOTE

Riders CAN NO LONGER continue their Cross Country round after elimination.

Four stops during the round = elimination and you can no longer continue.

Three stops at the same fence = elimination and you may no longer continue.

QUALIFICATIONS – JUNIORS/YOUNG RIDERS – new rule

Riders under the age of 18 must be granted permission to ride at 1* from EA National.

CNC**/CCN**

With the express permission of his National Federation, an Athlete may compete in a two star competition from the beginning of the calendar year in which the rider turns 16.

CNC*/CCN*

With the express permission of his National Federation, an Athlete may compete in a one star competition from the beginning of the calendar year in which the rider turns 14.

For Junior/Young Riders under the age of 18 (17yrs and below) wanting to compete in a CNC* for the first time, they must request permission from their State Eventing Committee.

Each exemption is for a COMBINATION, not just for the Rider. Exemption must be sought for each horse a Junior/Young Rider intends to compete on at 1* level.

An example letter can be viewed on the next page.

For Junior/Young Riders under the age of 18 (17yrs and below)

Wanting to compete in a CIC* for the first time, they must request permission from the EA National Eventing committee via their State Eventing Committee.

Each exemption is for a COMBINATION, not just for the Rider. Exemption must be sought for each horse a Junior/Young Rider intends to compete on at 1* level.

She is entered at 1 Star level for Reynella Horse Trials in November on Mr Chips.

If she doesn't upgrade at Reynella, she will do so early next season, planning to qualify for Melbourne in 2018

THE COMPETITION

including Hints, Tips and General Rules

GENERAL

- The WELFARE OF THE HORSE IS PARAMOUNT
Make sure you have adequate sized water buckets, particularly on hot days!
- Make sure you know what saddlery/tack you can use. Rules regarding accepted bits are often changing.
- Have a bridle and/or saddle cloth number.
- A back number holder – the OC will provide the number.
- Body protectors for Cross Country is COMPULSORY.
- Body protectors for Show Jumping are optional – but you must still wear your jacket unless summer uniform is announced on the day!

ENTRIES

- Enter correctly, with correct EA numbers and contact details...putting dots or dashes risks having your entry returned or rejected ** Event organisers have enough to do for you without chasing you for your EA Membership or Registration numbers..!!!!!!
- Check your invoice from Nominate immediately and email if you have made an error, don't wait until the draw comes out to get it corrected.
- Read and understand the refund policy
- Carefully read the schedule. Not all venues allow own yards.
- Book your yard at time of entry if needed as late yards are not always available
- NEVER put your horse in a yard if you have not booked one.

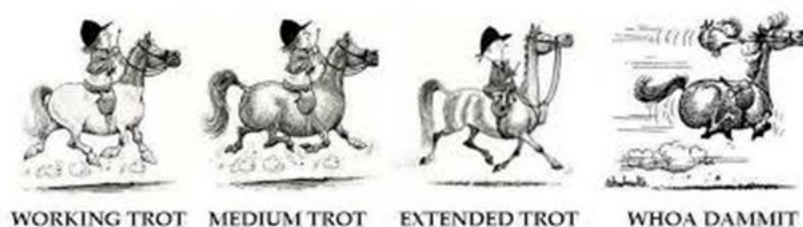
ON ARRIVAL

- Get your horse settled first
- Go to the Event office and pick up your back number -don't wait until Sunday to pick up your back number the office may think you are a 'no show' and advise the dressage judge that you aren't competing.
- Pick up a program and XC map if already available.
- Make a note of who the Rider Representatives are and know their mobile number. The Riders Reps are there to help you and answer your questions or queries
- Get an idea of the layout of the grounds and where your dressage arena is
- Your bridle number/saddle cloth number must be on your horse at ALL TIMES when the horse isn't in its yard or tied to your float / truck
- Turn up on time or early for each phase. If something happens, loose shoe etc notify the office as soon as possible.



DRESSAGE

- Do not ride within 15 metres of any arena while others are doing their test
- No whips, give your whip to someone or drop it when leaving the warmup area.
- Know at least two numbers, in the draw that you follow, it isn't always in numerical order. And sometimes people have scratched
- You do not have to speak to the Judge, you can just ride around the car so she can see your number and be ready to enter the arena when signalled (usually a horn) You have 45 seconds to enter after the signal. Or you can present to the Judge if you prefer.
- Your horses bit may be checked either prior to the test or after the test. Make sure you know what bits are allowed. You will be eliminated if the bit is not allowed
- No boots on horses and no callers – make sure you know your test to avoid extra penalties or elimination!
- Three Errors of Course means elimination.
- Errors of course include going the wrong way, forgetting a movement, not saluting, halting at the wrong marker, not halting or halting when not required...know your test! But if you get confused the judge will help you. Ask the judge for assistance rather than continuing to make errors
- Other errors don't count for Elimination but deduct 2 marks for every error.
- Other errors include entering the arena with a whip, boots on your horse or not wearing gloves in the higher classes.
- If you have another error, it will need to be corrected, e.g. drop the whip or someone will need to enter the arena and remove horse boots.
- Spurs are not compulsory at any level of competition, but make sure you know which ones are legal!
- Nose bands are compulsory...various types are allowed
- Any fall is elimination



SHOWJUMPING

- Course walks will always be held 15-10 minutes before the start of the course and sometimes throughout the class - maybe every hour or so. It is best to try to walk before the class starts
- Ask the marshal if it is 'close' to numerical order or if it is a put your number down system
- Once you enter the warmup arena, know that you will only have a few minutes to warm up...maybe 6 minutes.
- The warm up jumps will be flagged, you can only ride in that direction. White flag on the left, red flag on the right
- Be ready to go into the arena when called or as the horse in front is finishing.
- Ensure you ride past the judge with your number showing, you might also have to call your number out.
- Salute the Judge, usually by touching your helmet with your whip or a clear nod of your head.
- You have 45 seconds to go through the start flags after the bell has rung.
- DO NOT start before the bell has been rung.
- If you have a refusal and the jump is knocked down the bell will ring, you will get 6 penalties for the rebuilding of the jump and then you can go to the rebuilt jump again AFTER the bell is rung again
- At obstacles with elements e.g. A and B, if you have a refusal at part B you must re jump part A first then B for the show jumping phase
- A circle or a disobedience anywhere on course, jump related or not will incur 4 penalties
- Any fall is elimination
- Leave the course quickly after the finish and watch for the next rider coming in



CROSS COUNTRY

- Ensure you know your course and understand what you can do, especially at any combinations - a, b, c....and water jumps
- If in doubt ask your Riders Rep. If the Riders Rep can't help you ask to speak to the Technical Delegate (TD) - before the start of the Cross Country – he or she won't be available after the Cross-Country has started
- Long hair must be tied up in a bun or hair net, no plaits or pony tails...this is now a rule!
- Listen to the marshal and be ready to go to the starter on time
- Walk calmly around and in and out of the start box
- If you are wearing a watch and have minute markers start your watch on the 20 sec or 10 sec countdown
- If you need your horse can be led into the start box
- You can't deliberately start early but if your horse gets 'hard to handle' on the last seconds of countdown you may go, but your time will be taken at the time of starting
- Be prepared to be pulled up on course, there may be an accident. The jump Judge will ask you to stop and they will take your held time
- If someone wants to overtake you by calling 'coming through' move away and let them overtake you
- Overtake carefully and if another rider is in your road circle rather than have an accident – you can ask the TD to take some time off if you are held up by someone
- If you have 3 refusals at the same jump or 4 refusals anywhere on course (EvA105 and below) you are eliminated and you can't continue. You must leave the course at a walk (mounted or unmounted) failure to stop and leave will result in a Yellow Card.
- If you have 3 refusals at any jump or a total of 3 refusals at various jumps in CNC*/CIC*/CCI* and above you are eliminated and you cannot continue. Failure to stop and leave the course will result in a Yellow Card.
- If you are unsure if you have passed through the flags you can jump the fence again – BUT - if you were marked as clear the first time you will incur Penalties instead of elimination. YOU CAN NO LONGER ASK THE JUMP JUDGE...!!
- A refusal is when a horse disobediently tries to avoid a jump, there is no set distance. You must represent by either circling or continuing your efforts to make the horse present to the jump
- You can never jump a jump over 30cms from a stand still. You must turn away and present again. At drop offs, or entering water with no jump involved, there may be a moment of hesitation.
- If you have a refusal at a combination obstacle, e.g. element B, you do not have to jump A again but you may jump A again. This is only for ABC elements. Never jump a single numbered jump again!
- Be careful you cannot jump a jump from another level nor jump a jump backwards
- Do not waste time or circle to use up time close to the finish nor gallop very fast to the finish line.
- Any fall is elimination



OTHER THINGS YOU SHOULD KNOW

- KNOW THE RULES AND IF YOU ARE UNSURE ASK!!
- Consider having a breastplate and/or neck strap when jumping...it is not a rule but they can be helpful
- All queries should be in writing, forms are available at the office and there is NO charge
- If you are unhappy with your query outcome, you can lodge a protest but this will incur a charge that will not be refunded if you lose
- Do not leave the venue until results are posted...no changes can be made after presentation
- NO RIDER who has fallen anywhere at the venue can leave the venue without being cleared by the paramedic...even just a slip off! This is an automatic yellow card offence
- Make sure you understand about yellow cards and official warnings
- Enjoy Eventing!!!

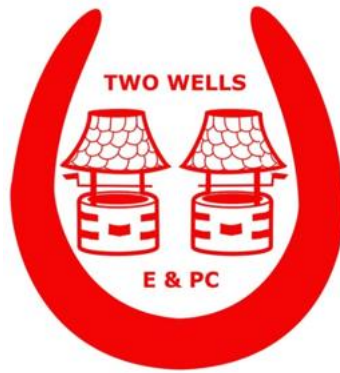

Checking around jump for any issues before start and managing spectators during event

What is the definition of clear

What is a simple refusal

What is a fall

Advice on drawing a diagram/ commenting on anything unusual

Advice to the rider after 3 refusals at your fence that they are eliminated

That they may advise a rider if asked whether they are clear or not and the other assistance they may give.

What to do and how to get help in the event of an incident.

Stopping horses on course-how this will be managed-what to do.

If radios are used then simple radio instructions:
 How to call –how to avoid blocking the channel
 What to call in.

Anything complex regarding combinations etc I prefer to deal with at the fence with the particular judge rather than hold up the briefing as the briefing usually starts late and there is a rush to get out on course.

Timing officials only

Starter/Finishers-advise them to check watches for synchronization every 10 horses

First and last fence advise them to fill out time of each horse passing their fence

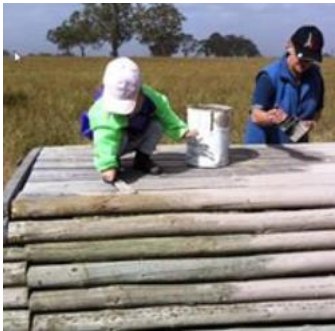

MEDICAL/VETERINARY GUIDELINES

Please ensure that you check and double check your medical requirements as per the current Rules. The following information is meant as a guide only as Rules are often updated.

- A first aid service must be present at all times.
- Emergency vehicles must be able to access all parts of the venue. Cross Country Test
- An ambulance (or paramedic equivalent) MUST be present during the cross-country test.
- A Doctor SHOULD be present during the cross-country tests.

If the ambulance (or paramedic equivalent) is not on the ground, then the Cross Country Test must be halted.

A Doctor (with an appropriately equipped first aid service) and/or a fully equipped emergency ambulance (or paramedic equivalent) should be present during the jumping test.

The EA Branch or its representative (i.e. the Technical Delegate) may vary these requirements in exceptional circumstances.

VETERINARY

- A Veterinary Surgeon must be present during the jumping and cross-country tests.
- A Veterinary Surgeon must be available on call for the duration of the event.

The EA Branch or its representative (e.g. the Technical Delegate) may vary these requirements in exceptional circumstances.

Should there be no Veterinary Surgeon present, all athletes should be informed before they compete. Destruction of Severely Injured Horses

If a horse is so severely injured that on humanitarian grounds it ought to be destroyed, the following procedure will apply:

If the owner or his authorised representative is present, his agreement will first be obtained by the official

Veterinary Surgeon

If the owner or his representative is not available, the Technical Delegate, acting on the advice of the official Veterinary Surgeon, may order the destruction of the horse.

Communication

Organisers must arrange adequate communication involving all emergency services and key officials.

Athlete Fitness & Medical card To ensure that vital information is available to first aid or medical personnel in case of emergency, athletes must comply with the following:

a) providing a valid contact information is mandatory for all Athletes – the telephone number of an accompanying Person/next-of-kin must be provided to the Event Secretariat upon arrival (OC and medical officer to ensure all information has been received before the Cross-Country)

b) Declaration of medical condition – Athletes with medical conditions that may be relevant in the case of a medical emergency are responsible, at every Event when riding, for wearing a medical data carrier* from a system provider able to communicate information in English. Alternatively (and at the minimum) a medical armband of good quality can be used. Athletes who choose to wear an armband should download and fill in the form available for this purpose on EA's website.

* Medical data carrier (also called medical identification tag): small emblem or tag worn on a bracelet, neck chain, or on the clothing, intended to alert paramedics/physicians/first responders that the wearer has an important medical condition.

Conditions that are relevant include recent head injury, serious past injuries/surgeries, chronic health problems such as diabetes, long term medications and allergies. If in doubt, the Athlete should discuss this with their own treating physician.

Examination after a fall - Medical Fitness

If there is any doubt in regard to fitness to compete the Ground Jury or Technical Delegate may eliminate the athlete at its discretion.

A veterinarian and/or an Official Medical Officer as appropriate should examine all horses and athletes that have a fall during training or competition before they either take part in another test, event or leave the competition site.
