STATE JUMPING SQUADS

2024



The purpose of our State Jumping Squads is to recognise and develop athletes so they are able to move up to the next level of competition, with a professional and guided background, to represent South Australia at the State and National Championship levels.

SA State Jumping Squads:

- SA Junior Squad 1.15m
- SA Young Rider Squad 1.25m – 1.30m
- SA Senior Squad 1.30m - 1.40m
- SA Senior Recognition Squad 1.20m
- SA Development Squad 1.05m

General Criteria for Inclusion on all Squads

Squad riders must have a commitment to High-Performance Jumping Programs, Squad activities and ongoing development.

- Riders on the Squad must be prepared to attend squad clinics with their selected horse.
- Riders must be current members of the ESA branch.
- Horses must be EA registered and hold a current competition license.
- Horses must be sound and fit to compete.
- Where applicable, be available for Team selection for State and National competitions.
- In all cases, the applicant will be required to provide evidence of performance from two separate affiliated events in the preceding 12 months, with a score of four faults or less in the first round of competition. The performances must be relevant to the Squad being applied for.
- Riders must show a willingness to be leaders in their sport, present themselves as role models, assist younger riders when needed and be a supportive squad team member.
- It is expected that all squad members comply with EA rules, regulations and codes of conduct, including those relating to horse welfare.

Training Opportunities

Squad clinics with competent coaches will be arranged throughout the year for Squad horse & rider combinations. Where practical, we will endeavor to combine horses with other horses on the same squad. We will also take into consideration the current training level and availability.

There is a requirement for Squad riders to make themselves available for a minimum of 2 Squad clinics and development opportunities, assist and/or volunteer at Jumping SA events and provide regular reports on their ongoing performances.
