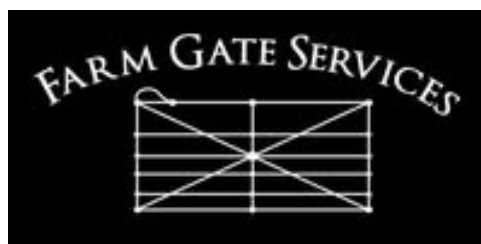

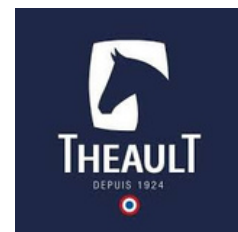

TERMS & CONDITIONS

This event will run under EA/FEI rules. The Organising Committee (OC) reserves the right to change or amend the program at their discretion. All owners and competitors will be personally responsible for damages to any third parties caused by themselves, their employees, their agents or their horses. Please ensure the safety of your children whilst in proximity to horses.

1. Closing Date of Entries – **Monday 20th April @ MIDNIGHT**
2. Entries Online via Equipe - **Opening Monday 6th April**
3. Equestrian South Australia will conduct the 2025 South Australian State Jumping Championships under the auspices of Equestrian Australia (EA) in strict accordance with FEI and EA National Show Jumping Rules (Effective January 2025, as amended).

5. The following applies:
6. RIDERS taking part in the Event must be financial members of EA. Riders must be competitive members if competing in classes 1.05m. and above. Riders must be minimum Participant members if competing in classes 1.04m and below. All horses must have base registration. If competing in classes 1.05m and above, those horses must have full registration and hold a jumping licence.
7. HORSES competing in classes 1.05m and above must be registered with EA, have a current Jumping Competition License (formerly Performance Card) and be owned by a financial member of EA. Proof of Jumping License must be produced upon request.
8. Entries MUST have ALL HORSE, RIDER AND OWNER details including EA registration (where applicable) and membership numbers (where applicable). All competitors are strongly encouraged to submit their entries via Equipe and pay fees by direct deposit or credit card.
9. Swabbing: Random swabbing will take place. A swabbing fee of \$20.00 per horse must be paid with entries. Please make yourself aware of prohibited substances and the relevant withdrawal period. Check the ingredients of all products you are using including herbal products with your vet. Security and access to the horse is the sole responsibility of the owner/rider.
10. The Organising Committee reserves the right at its absolute discretion to alter or amend any part of the program.
11. The Organising Committee reserves the right to refuse entry without giving a reason and to ballot horses if necessary.
12. Protests are to be submitted in writing to the show committee within 30 minutes of the incident or the announcement of placings and with a fee of \$50.00, to be refunded if protest is upheld.
13. **Late Entries may be accepted at the discretion of the organising committee and will incur a \$10.00 fee per class.** Late entries will start FIRST in the draw.
14. Substitution of a nominated horse may take place only within the nominated Classes and must be notified to the Secretary at least two hours prior to the commencement of the Class.
15. Jumping horses may be transferred from one class to another, without incurring a late entry fee but additional entry money if appropriate must be paid. This must be done by 8.00am on each day.
16. Scratching: 75% of entry fee will be refunded only if Veterinary Certificate or Doctors Certificate is produced within 3 days of the competition. Once an entry is accepted, the Grounds Fee is non- refundable.
17. Ground fee of \$10.00 per horse, per day or \$30 per horse per show must be paid with entries
18. Juniors: Competitors may take part in competitions for juniors until the end of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 18.
19. Horses may only compete in one of the Junior, Under 25 or Senior Championships categories.
20. Mini Prix horses may not start in other Title series i.e., Senior or Junior
21. Horses may have maximum of 2 starts in one day. The Organising Committee has the right to refuse an entry.
22. Dress Code - Riders in all competition rings must be in correct dress unless otherwise instructed by the judge. It is compulsory for athletes to wear a tagged and properly fastened helmet whilst mounted. As an exception senior athletes may remove their helmet at the presentation in the competition arena only.
23. Stallions - The Organising Committee follows the EA stallion code of conduct. Guardians of riders/handlers under 17 years must take responsibility for stallions at all times including when leading, riding or stabling stallions throughout the venue.
24. Dogs - Dogs must be kept on a leash and under effective control at all times. Dogs are not permitted in warm up or competition areas.
25. Prize money will be paid directly into the competitor's nominated bank account within 10 working days of the event. If incorrect bank details are supplied prize money will be forfeited. Prize money in **Ring 2** may be adjusted or substituted for vouchers at the committee's discretion.
26. Yards and Camping is all to be booked at time of entries.
27. NO STRAW to be used in portable yards. Sawdust accepted. All yards must be cleaned out & manure removed from the premises. All manure is required to be bagged up for easy disposal or taken by competitors. The cost of Camping is \$42 for powered or \$12 unpowered per night.
28. Medical fee is charged per rider at a cost of \$30. Please be aware the cost of medical staff has increased greatly and this fee is used to ensure we have the right medical staff on site.

NOMINATION & SCORING CONDITIONS

Nomination Conditions for Junior, Under 25 and Senior classes:

Competitors whose age allows them to compete in different divisions may do so but only if on different horses.

Junior: Athletes can take part in Competitions for Juniors until the end of the calendar year, in which they reach the age of 18 years. Athletes may take part in open Competitions 1.20m and above from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 12 years.

Under 25: Athletes can take part in Competitions for Under 25 from the calendar year in which they turn 16 years old until the end of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 25 years.

Senior Rider: Athletes are eligible to compete from the beginning of the calendar year in which they turn 18 years

Nomination conditions for Mini Prix:

Horses starting in the Mini Prix may not start in any title class i.e Junior, Under 25 and Senior Championship categories but may start in height classes should horse welfare allow.

Nomination conditions for Amateur Series:

Amateur Rider classes are classes for Athletes who:

Must not have competed in an Olympic Games or World Equestrian Games in either Jumping or Eventing.

In the past 10 years must not have competed in a World Cup for Jumpin Riders qualifying round or in a 4* 3 day event.

Must not have competed in section 1 and 2 at a Royal Show in Sydney, Brisbane, Melbourne, Adelaide or Perth in the past two years.

Amateur Riders may not compete in an Amateur class on a Horse that will compete in any class where the first round is higher than 1.20m.

Athletes may compete as amateurs from the beginning of the calendar year in which they turn 21 years of age.

Nomination and scoring conditions for Thorough Care Best Performed Thoroughbred:

This is open to Thoroughbreds that are 4 years old and over, have officially raced or trialled either locally, nationally or internationally and who are registered with the RISA (Racing Information Services Australia). Registrations will be checked by OC.

The winner will be the combination with the most points. Points will be calculated on the following format. 5 points for 1st, 4 points for 2nd, 3 points for 3rd, 2 points for 4th and 1 point for 5th. A further 1 point is given for each clear round over the duration of the 3 days.

In the case of equal placings the combination competing at the higher level will win.

Scoring Conditions for Best Performed Horses in Both Arenas:

A trophy rug will be presented to the best performed horse in both Arenas. The rugs are kindly donated by Dapple Eq.

The winner will be the combination with the most points. Points will be calculated on the following format. 5 points for 1st, 4 points for 2nd, 3 points for 3rd, 2 points for 4th and 1 point for 5th. In the case of equal placings the combination competing at the higher level will win.

NOMINATION & SCORING CONDITIONS cont...

Nomination and scoring conditions for Open Height Series classes:

The six height classes (Topaz, Jade, Pearl, Opal, Sapphire, Diamond & Amateur) will run across three rounds. Each round is run as a standalone class, and points are awarded in every round, including the final. At the completion of Round 3, an overall Champion will be declared for each Series and awarded with a trophy rug and sash.

The Champion is the horse and rider combination that has accumulated the highest total points across all three rounds.

Points are awarded based on placing in each round, with later rounds carrying greater importance:

- Round 1: 100% (Base points starting at 40 for 1st)
- Round 2: 120% of Round 1 points
- Round 3: 150% of Round 1 points

POINTS ALLOCATION:

- Points are awarded to all competitors up to 20th place.
- Placings after 20th place receive 1 point.
- Eliminated combinations receive 0 points.
- Classes with fewer than 20 starters will have points awarded to all competitors, following the same scale.
- This scoring system applies to every round, including Round 3.

*To be eligible for the series, you must enter all three classes. Combinations can only register for ONE full series, as eligibility is limited to winning **ONE** series. Riders may choose to enter individual height classes or all three in the series.*

NOTE: *When registering for a series through Equipe, please select all three classes in the series to qualify for the bulk discount.*

2. To be eligible to participate in this event you must be a current ESA member or current member of an EA state branch. You must also satisfy any further membership or registration requirement (including those for any horse entered) referred to in the General Conditions of Entry for the event (Conditions of Entry) and individual disciplines.
3. The EA National Sports Rules applicable to the event are referred to in the Conditions of Entry.
4. All EA and ESA events are subject to the EA Code of Conduct (Code of Conduct). The Code of Conduct can be accessed on the EA website via the following link http://www.equestrian.org.au/sites/default/files/Equestrian_Australia_Code_of_Conduct.pdf
5. It is important that all members understand that the Code of Conduct also covers parents, guardians and spectators in respect of any activity held or sanctioned by ESA or an EA state branch. A key aim of the Code of Conduct is to respect the rights of everyone involved, to abide by all EA rules and requirements, to be fair, considerate, honest and professional in all aspects of the sport.
6. EA and ESA are committed to the protection and welfare of its members. The EA Member Protection Policy (MPP) can be accessed on its website via the following link http://www.equestrian.org.au/sites/default/files/Equestrian_Australia_Member_Protection_Policy_updated05072017.pdf.
7. The EA Social Media Policy, which can be accessed via the following link, <http://www.equestrian.org.au/sites/default/files/Social%20Media%20Policy.pdf> should be read in conjunction with the MPP. These are important documents designed to ensure the safe and fair conduct of the event for everyone involved. They should be read, understood and complied with.
8. EA and ESA events are also subject to various codes and regulations designed to protect the horse, the welfare of which is paramount (Horse Welfare Provisions). Entrants and Competitors must familiarise themselves with the Horse Welfare Provisions and ensure that they are complied with. These Provisions may be accessed on the EA website via the following link <http://www.equestrian.org.au/policies>
9. Entrants and Competitors must familiarise themselves with the provisions of the EA documents referred to above (EA documents) and ensure that they comply with them.
10. By submitting an entry for the event you agree to comply with and be bound by the provisions of the EA documents, these Special Conditions and the Conditions of Entry.
11. If you are the parent or guardian of a participant or competitor under the age of 18 years, by submitting an entry for the event you consent to their participation in the event and undertake to the best of your ability to ensure that they understand and comply with the provisions of the EA documents, these Special Conditions and The Conditions of Entry.
12. If there is any conflict in the interpretation between the provisions of the General Regulations and any of the EA documents, these Special Conditions or the Conditions of Entry, the General Regulations will take precedence. If there is any conflict in the interpretation between the provisions of these Special Conditions and the Conditions of Entry, the Special Conditions will take precedence.
13. The Organising Committee for the event is referred to in the Conditions of Entry. The Organising Committee may at its absolute discretion, decline to receive any entry or return any fee without being liable for any compensation: General Regulation, Article 116.11. The Organising Committee's decision in relation to any entry for the event shall be final and binding.

Cancellation and Refund

1. ESA or the Organising Committee may cancel the event due to catastrophic conditions, disease or force majeure, or for any other reason at its absolute discretion.
2. If the event is cancelled after it has commenced there will be no refunds. If the event is cancelled prior to commencement the entrant may be entitled to a proportional refund of the entry fees paid. Any such refund will be determined at the absolute discretion of ESA, having regard to the direct or fixed costs for the event.
3. Entrants who have provided with their entry an email address and/or mobile phone number will be notified of event cancellation by email and/or text message.
4. The refund policy for withdrawal, scratching or change of an entry is set out in the Conditions of Entry.

Release and Indemnity

1. You acknowledge that horse riding, working with or being around horses can be dangerous. Horses can act in sudden and unpredictable ways, especially if frightened or hurt. As a consequence, there is a real risk of damage to property, serious injury or even death. In consideration of acceptance of your entry and participation in the event you agree to release and forever discharge EA, ESA, their servants and agents and the Organising Committee and each member thereof from all claims, proceedings or demands for any loss or damage howsoever arising from any accident or incident occurring at the event.
2. In consideration of acceptance of your entry and participation in the event, you agree to indemnify and keep indemnified EA, ESA, their servants and agents and the Organising Committee and each member thereof against all claims, proceedings or demands brought by or on behalf of any participant or competitor named in your entry form for any loss or damage howsoever arising from any accident or incident occurring at the event.

HORSE WELFARE & RISK MANAGEMENT

Welfare of the Horse

In all equestrian sports the horse must be considered paramount.

The well being of the horse shall be taken above the demands of the breeders, trainers, riders, owners, dealers, organisers, sponsors or officials.

All handling and veterinary treatment must ensure the health and welfare of the horse.

The highest standards of nutrition, health, sanitation and safety shall be encouraged and maintained at all times. Adequate provision must be made for ventilation, feeding, watering and maintaining a healthy environment during transportation. Emphasis should be placed on increasing education in training and equestrian practices and on promoting scientific studies in equine health.

In the interests of the horse, the fitness and competence of the rider shall be regarded as essential.

All riding and training methods must take account of the horse as a living entity and must not include any technique considered by the FEI/EA to be abusive.

The national and international Rules and Regulations in equestrian sport regarding the health and welfare of the horse must be adhered to not only during the national and international events, but also in the training.

Competition Rules and Regulations shall be continually reviewed to ensure such welfare.

Mount Pleasant Show Grounds Risk Management

It is a privilege that you are allowed to bring your dog to this venue. We insist you keep your dog under effective control at all times.

Approved and tagged Safety Helmets must be worn at all times when riding. Riding of horses bareback is prohibited. Riding of rugged and/or unbridled horses is prohibited.

Stallions must have an adult handler in the vicinity at all times. Horses are not permitted near pedestrian doorways. Bicycles are not permitted near doors designated as public entrances or exits. Speed limits must be adhered to at all times, the speed limit is 10km p/h. Power leads must not be on the ground or over roadways. Construction of portable/tape yards is prohibited. Please observe all signs at the venue.

Horses must be tied in a safe manner. Horses must not be tied to unattached floats, wheelie bins etc. No infrastructure to be erected on Grounds without written approval by management prior to event. The Premises be left in a clean, undamaged state. Should this not occur, additional cleaning costs will be charged accordingly.

Noise level to be controlled and excessive noise prohibited. Music must be kept to a level that avoids disruption to nearby residential areas.

No smoking is allowed in Undercover Yards or any building.

Report to ORGANISING COMMITTEE any hazard or incidents involving a person or property damage as soon as possible.

No Straw to be used in portable yards, sawdust only. Please remove own manure from premises where possible.

All manure must be bagged up. Fees will be charged for anyone not cleaning up after their horses.
