

EO UPDATE

As I reflect on the past couple of months since our last newsletter it appears that progress in some areas has been slow with some significant achievements in other areas. It has been a difficult couple of months for me personally and I thank the team and the Board for their support during this time.

EA update

EA has been busy with the appointment of new staff, reviewing and planning for our future. There were some notable events we attended that required our feedback, these were:

- First Strategic Plan forum hosted (ESA EO, Chair attended)
- High Performance Strategic Plan forum hosted (ESA EO, Chair attended)
- Health & Safety Conference currently being hosted

EA will be providing a more detailed communication in relation to the Strategic (including the High Performance component) Plan directly to members.

EA takes the lead in adopting National Integrity Framework

Equestrian Australia (EA) announced recently that it is one of the first Olympic sports in Australia to adopt the Sport Integrity Australia National Integrity Framework (NIF). This is a massive step forward for Equestrian and, as part of a strong collaboration with Sport Integrity Australia, will start to address many of the key issues impacting our sport for decades. The implementation of the Framework as one of the responses to mitigating integrity threats to the sport of Equestrian, is an extremely proactive step. Office Recreation Sport and Racing (ORSR) South Australia

After the disappointment of not being successful for Game On Funding we joined Sport SA and many other sports in voicing our concerns over the timing and appropriation of \$2M of the \$2.3M of funds available to entities outside of sport and recreation sector. The Game On funding were a direct replacement for the Development and Inclusion Program funding (\$3.2M), part of which funded the Gillian Rolton Youth Development Scholarship Program (GRYDSP). We believe as a result of the concerns raised in relation to Game On funding the ORSR are currently reviewing the application process and requirements before advising of the next round of funding for which we will be eligible to apply.

A review of Sustainability funding, that ESA as a State Sport Organisation (SSO) has received annually over the years, has resulted in a new funding stream to be known as State Sector (SS) funding. Our Sustainability funding agreement was extended for this financial to allow for implementation of the SS funding. It is apparent that the SS total funding will be reduced by 50% with SSO's with \$5M+ and less than \$75K being ineligible to apply. As ESA has a turnover of \$1M+ we will be eligible to apply.

ESA Awards Night

We are pleased to announce the ESA Awards Night will be held on the 29th January 2022. We are finalising the details and will be releasing tickets in January 2022 for purchase.

Please be aware there will be an increase in the ticket price that reflects the upgrade in venue this year, and the income required against all the expenses for hosting the night.

We look forward to seeing you there for a fun evening, whilst celebrating SA's equestrian achievements.

What does this all mean for ESA?

The GRYDSP will no longer be funded by ORSR. We have had a number of discussions with the Discipline Committees in continuing a development program for young riders. The consensus was to provide a long term development program for young riders rather than a weekend[s] of development. Each Discipline is reviewing their pathway to assist in determining what the program may look like and where it fits within the pathway. I am currently developing a generic framework for Disciplines to consider, when reviewing and developing a Discipline specific program. Unless further funding can be secured the program it will be a user pay system.

We will apply for State Sector funding but anticipate a reduction in funding. We will need to diversify our income that will require us to evaluate our commercial properties and be conscious of our brand and reputation in the market place when seeking funding.

ESA Governance review implementation plan

As you may be aware a governance review implementation plan was developed in 2019 and we continue to work towards finalising the implementation of the recommendations from the review. We are making progress in the areas identified in the review.

ESA Strategic Plan

As our strategic plan expired in 2020 we have engaged Wallace Long from C2M to facilitate our new strategic and operational plan[s]. The process involves four stages: discovery; engagement; development of the strategy and plan[s]. A working group was established to confirm our approach, scope of works and the timeline. We have examined the market, political, economic, social, technological, environmental, legal factors that are present and sporting industry trends throughout the process. The results of the stakeholder survey that was conducted with members in 2019 has been taken into consideration as part of the engagement process. A DRAFT Strategy has been developed for review and community feedback before being finalised.

ESA AGM

The ESA AGM was held on the 26th October 2021. The DRAFT 2021 and final 2020 AGM Minutes will be circulated to members. We congratulate Wendy Schaeffer Macdonald and Ian Nitschke on their appointments to the ESA Board. Wendy Schaeffer Macdonald and Craig Hannam were re-elected Chair and Vice Chair respectively at the ESA Board meeting following the AGM. Congratulations to Discipline Committees members (please refer to the DRAFT 2021 AGM Minutes for a full list of these members) that were appointed by the Board and announced at the AGM.

ESA Office closure

Please note the ESA office will close at midday on the 22nd December 2021 and reopen on the 4th January 2022. We take this opportunity to wish you a very Merry Christmas and safe and Happy New Year for 2022.

We look forward to continuing to provide events, activities and services to our members in 2022.

The ESA Board meets monthly at a minimum and our meetings with the DC's have moved from monthly to bimonthly. We apologise for the delay in completing the Board meeting summaries and posting them on the web site. We will endeavour to finish the outstanding summaries prior to our office closing for Christmas.

ESA/EA Membership

We thank you for renewing your membership. Our current membership is 1204, we are on target to retain or exceed our membership from 2021.



DRIVING

It was disappointing that the Adelaide and Melbourne Royals were cancelled again this year because of COVID . We were all looking forward to competing at these major events and working our horses and ponies with this goal in mind. However some Agricultural Shows were able to hold Harness Classes. These included Kadina in August, Murray Bridge in September and Kapunda in October. In the South East was Mil Lel and Millicent.

Competitor numbers were quite good considering COVID restrictions. At Kadina Champion Non Hackney Horse or Pony went to Lentara Harveston and Anne Lindh. The harness pair class was won by Harveston and his Shetland "mate" Lentara Limited Edition. Morgan Lindh aged 16 won Reserve Champion Driver.

At Murray Bridge, it was a first outing for Chris Lawrie and his Hackney pony The Doune Regal. This pony was exceptional and shows the hard work Chris has done to get him to this level in a short time. He won Champion Hackney Horse or Pony. Another newcomer at Murray Bridge was a Shetland Pony belonging to the Fricker family Balnagown Maclachlan and driven by Jackie Boyd. This pony won the Viceroy Turnout and went on to win the Champion Turnout.

Lentara Harveston won the Pony under 11 hands and was Champion Non Hackney Pony.

At Kapunda, Chris Lawrie again won the Champion Hackney Pony and Supreme Harness Exhibit. This pony's stable name in Vince after the master Hackney driver Vince Corvi and like Vince Corvi destined for a big career.

Lentara Harveston again won Champion Non Hackney pony and the pair class. Both Shetland ponies had featured in the Tiny Tots classes earlier in the day with Will and Gus Maitland aged 2 and 4.

At Millicent, Balnagown Maclachlan won the Champion Non Hackney Pony.



DRESSAGE



EVENTING

Spring has provided our riders with some wonderful eventing weather and excellent ground conditions. COVID restrictions continue to complicate event organisation, but despite this we have seen successful horse trials run at Canoe Tree and Reynella. In addition, we have had training days at both venues, several squad days, and a number of unofficial competitions including the Monarto Horse Trials Supercross, Hallmark Farm Derby Days and the Naracoorte Horse Trials Spring Fling. The organisers of all these events are to be congratulated for their flexibility and determination - rearranging their schedules and dates to meet COVID requirements and constraints, often at short notice.

Squad members have had several training days during the spring. Local show jump course designer and judge Andrew Paech stepped in when regular squad coach Jamie Coman was unable to travel to the planned jumping clinic in late August. Andrew's clinic was extremely well received and a highlight for younger squad members was learning more about the art of walking a course.

This was followed by a cross country clinic, held in conjunction with the Reynella Horse Trials training day in mid-September. The day began with an off-horse session where squad members watched a cross country masterclass with 2018 World Eventing Champion Ros Canter, before heading out on course. Coaches Wendy Schaeffer-Macdonald, Nigel Treloar and Megan Jones were strategically positioned on course to assist, with senior riders Rachelle Verma and Sarah Clark helping lead riders where necessary. It's great to see our experienced riders helping the juniors in this way.

Squads have also had access to the online Competitive Edge Program, developed by Equestrian Australia and offered across all states. The program provides a wealth of information from experts in a range of topics, from sport psychology to veterinary medicine. Squad members from all disciplines are encouraged to enrol in the program, which will be available again in 2022.



TRAVEL RESTRICTIONS

Sadly our senior riders have had little opportunity to gain qualifications. Travel restrictions affecting the ability of suitable officials to come to South Australia and preventing our riders from travelling interstate, combined with widespread event cancellations has meant it has been a lean year for high level competition. We hope 2022 will bring significant improvement in this situation.

UP AND COMING CLINIC

Equine Pathways Australia Clinic Date: 4th & 5th December

Rider riders with physical disabilities and para riders. EPA was developed from real experience of people with injury, illness or disability looking to personally develop and improve their life opportunities and well being. Their philosophy is to offer the chance to participate in a community-based program, using horses, shared with others with similar life experiences. This is achieved through integrated sporting, health and community participation programs and the identification and creation of vocational pathways. They use qualified dressage coaches and allied health providers providing services such as trauma counselling, physiotherapy, occupational therapy, sports psychology, nutritional advice, osteopathy and personal training.

Update & Tagging Availability

Helmet tagging is mandatory for all EA Affiliated Eventing competitions.From 1 January 2022, mandatory for all EA Affiliated Jumping events.From 1 July 2022, mandatory for all EA Affiliated Driving events.From 1 July 2022, mandatory for all EA Affiliated Dressage events.

Please note: Helmet taggers are volunteers, so please be patient with them.

Other points which may be of use to answer any questions:

- EA standards do not mandate helmet replacement after 5 years (Manufacturers do recommend replacement of helmets older than 5 years however, that is not an EA requirement, onus is on the rider)
- Helmet taggers are only checking compliance of the helmet against EA Standards, not condition, age or any other factors. An approved helmet is one than meets the EA Standards.
- The colour of the tag will only change if EA Standards change
- If helmets are being tagged at an outlet/franchise (eg. Horseland) this must be done by an approved EA Tagger
- Does the Helmet Tagger need to be an EA member? Being an EA member is preferred, however it is understood some OC members are not EA members and this can be looked at on a case-by-case basis.
