Riders and spectators are welcome to attend any of the Judge Education Seminars. They are a great opportunity to learn what Judges can see and how marks are awarded.

Congratulations

Congratulations to Helen Whittle on co-presenting the recent A/B seminar with Maria Schwennesen and also with Barrie Stratton at F/G. She has now successfully met all the requirements to be a Judge Educator. It's fantastic for South Australia to have another local Judge who is qualified to educate new and upgrading Judges.

April 2021 Seminars

Maria Schwennesen presented the A/B/C seminar at McLaren Park Equestrian Centre on the 24th April, followed by a Young Horse seminar on the 25th April. Thank you to the riders that volunteered to participate as demonstration test riders. Thanks also to all the Judges and spectators who attended and supported the weekend.

Whittlesea Dressage Committee Bursary

The Whittlesea Dressage Committee in Victoria has generously donated funds to help South Australian Dressage Judges travel to Victoria to gain experience shadow-judging Interstate to assist in the upgrading process. Congratulations to Cheryl Hatswell and Janene Clark who will both be shadow-judging at Werribee in Victoria in June.

South Australian Judges Subsidy Scheme

The ESA Dressage Judges Committee (ESA-DJC) recognises that to maintain accreditation, upgrade qualifications or gain further experience, Judges may need to travel Interstate. As this can be costly, the ESA-DJC has allocated funds from the SA Dressage Judges' Levies collected by Clubs, to support Judges travelling for further education.

The purpose of the subsidy scheme is to set out a framework for reimbursement for South Australian Judges travelling Interstate (and across regions) to upgrade, remain accredited or further their judging experience and will apply to any expenses incurred from 30th November 2019 to 30th June 2020 and during the financial year starting 1st July 2020. This will be continued for the financial year starting 1st July 2021.

The amounts noted in this document are intended as a guide only. Funding is subject to availability and will be reviewed as part of normal financial operations. The ESA-JSC will review all applications and approve those that meet the criteria and intention described below, and within the available budget. For subsidies numbered 1-3, funding is limited to five Judges per year. A Judge may only apply for one subsidy per financial year. Judges must check with the Committee to see whether funds are available before travelling.

Please note:

Judges maintaining accreditation or upgrading are encouraged to seek Judging appointments Interstate and then 'piggyback' - attending a Seminar or undertaking shadow -judging or sit-ins. Organising Committees may pay for at least part of airfares and accommodation and this then stretches our budget further and allows for more Judges to benefit from the scheme.

1. Upgrading to A or B Level

Judges upgrading to A or B Level may receive a subsidy of \$1,000 (maximum per Judge per level) for travel expenses to complete shadow-judging, sit-ins and the Practical Exam. This amount will be paid on the successful completion of the qualification. A report must be submitted to the Chair, ESA-JSC together with receipts for expenses.

2. Upgrading to C or D Level

Judges upgrading to C or D Level may receive a subsidy of \$500 (maximum per Judge per level) for travel expenses to complete shadow-judging, sit-ins and the Practical Exam. This amount will be paid on the successful completion of the qualification. A report must be submitted to the Chair, ESA-JSC together with receipts for expenses.

3. Gaining further experience in Judging Interstate

To encourage Judges to travel Interstate to see different horses and gain further experience in Judging, a subsidy of \$200 (maximum per Judge per level) will be paid for these Judges to write for higher level Judges, shadow-judge or sit-in at an Interstate event. The event and activity must be appropriate to the applicant's current or upgrading level. A report must be submitted to the Chair, ESA-JSC together with receipts for expenses.

4. Regional Judges Support

The ESA-DJC understands that for Judges in regional areas, the cost to attend seminars, workshops and shadow-judging can be prohibitive. Judges travelling in excess of 120 km (each way) from home to a venue to shadow-judge at a competition or attend a Seminar for the purpose of maintaining accreditation or upgrading, may receive a subsidy of \$0.50 per kilometre up to a maximum of \$250. Shared driving is encouraged where practical. Potential Judges who are travelling to attend a G-level Seminar or a competition for the purpose of shadow-judging may apply for reimbursement when they are appointed as a G-level Judge, at the completion of all the requirements. Regional Judges may submit one application per year.

DRESSAGE SA 21/22 HIGH PERFORMANCE SQUAD DOCUMENT

<u>Purpose</u>

The purpose of the Dressage South Australia (DSA) High Performance Squad is to identify horse/rider combinations that show the best and most consistent performances at high level competitions in South Australia. Ideally, these combinations will represent South Australia at Interstate and National events and will be role models for other riders.

High Performance Squad

Is a merit based Squad open to 16 horse/rider combinations, Senior Advanced –Grand Prix and Youth Novice – Medium.

The Squad will have express entry into the high performance on and off-horse training programs. It is expected that these riders will represent SA at Interstate and National Championship events where possible.

Should there be more applications than places then an average of the 3 submitted % will be used to determine the successful combinations by the selectors.

If there are not the required applicants who meet the qualifying scores, then spaces will stay vacant.

Squads are open to all competitive combinations including AOR and Pony combinations.

Qualifying Criteria and Scores

- An average of the 3 scores will be used to determine which combinations get priority.
- A minimum of 2 out of the 3 scores must be from SA HOTY competitions.
- 3 scores to be submitted each score needs to have been from tests with no less than 2 Judges. Percentages from 1/7/20 till 30/6/2021 will be required.

High Performance Squad from Advanced – Grand Prix Combinations

Should there be excess combinations apply there will be 1 Medium, 1 Big Tour place.

Minimum % to qualify:

- Advanced 67%
- Small Tour 63%
- Medium & Big Tour 60%

Youth High Performance Squad from Novice – Medium Combinations

Minimum % to qualify:

- Novice 70%
- Elementary 65%
- Medium 63%

High Performance Squad Criteria and Expectations

Riders need to be a current competitive member of ESA.

Owners need to be current members of ESA.00

Horses need to be registered with the EA and micro-chipped.

Horses must have current competition licence.

Horses must be sound and fit to satisfy competition standards from the beginning of the squad year.

Riders are role models for the sport and must conform to the EA Code of Conduct, Social Media Policy and Welfare of the Horse Policy.

Poor sportsmanship and inappropriate behaviour by squad members will not be tolerated. Combinations can be removed from the squad at the discretion of DSA Committee or ESA Board at any time if poor sportsmanship or inappropriate behaviour has been verified. Combinations will be formally notified of this decision and reasons will be outlined. Mentoring will be offered if the situation is appropriate with the aim of re-instatement.

Any rider that has disciplinary proceedings enforcing a term of suspension will automatically be removed from the squad for the remainder of the year.

Riders will receive squad badges for their saddle blanket and competition jacket.

The Senior riders will particularly be seen as role models to younger riders and their behaviour and adherence to the EA Code of Conduct must reflect this.

The Young Riders will particularly be seen as role models to their peers and their behaviour and adherence to the EA Code of Conduct must reflect this.

Riders will be asked to attend Judges' Clinics as demonstration rider/horse combinations from time to time.

Riders may be invited to attend training clinics and/or workshops conducted by DSA/DJSC and should make every effort to attend.

Riders will be provided opportunities for guidance from the EA National Squad program should they become available.

There will be no formal review scheduled however should positions become available combinations on the reserve list will be notified.

Applications will be open on nominate and close on 14 July 2021 with the High Performance squads being announced once the selectors have reviewed the applications ratified decisions are final.

DSA reserves the right to review and amend the selection criteria as and when required.

DRESSAGE SA PERFORMANCE MEDAL SCHEME

'Recognizing and rewarding high achievements in South Australian Dressage'

Performance medals are awarded to the rider. The horse and rider combination must gain three aggregate scores at one level listed below in Official competitions. HC scores and results with only one Judge will NOT be counted.

Medals will be awarded promptly after applications are received. Medal winners will be announced on the Equestrian SA Website.

The medals are designed to be worn on the rider's competition jacket.

The horse has a period of 2 years to obtain the three scores required to be eligible for a medal at each graded level.

The rider must have maintained ESA membership throughout the whole of their qualifying period and must reside in SA for 6 months of the year within the time of application.

A horse and rider are only eligible for one medal of each description (Gold, Silver, Bronze) in each graded level.

In the event that the horse is not owned by the rider, the owner's consent for the rider to receive a medal is given by signing the application form with the Applicant.



Sus has always had a love for horses, from riding her next door neighbor's Shetland at age 5, to finally getting her very first pony (a Fjord) named Peo that her parents bought her at age 11 after years of nagging - nagging can pay off!

After training all the dressage movements and finding this her forte, Sus eventually moved on to her Swedish WB to pursue her dreams of following in the footsteps of her idol the great Kyra Kyrkland and the magnificent 'Matador'.

Susanne's passions out of the saddle are being a Mum to her gorgeous little Felix and travelling. Pre-COVID she loved to jet-set around the globe with her family.

Zulu's strengths lie in her stoic nature and eagerness to please, however she has a bad habit of trying to chat up a nice looking boy when she should be concentrating on her dressage test ...

Susanne and Zulu's most recent career highlights include winning Reserve Champion Elementary AOR at the recent 2021 SA State Dressage Championships.

Onwards from here, under the watchful eye of their coach Linda O'Leary, Susanne and Zulu are looking to step up to Medium level in time for the upcoming Mid South East Country Dressage Champs and we wish them the very best of luck!

Young Horse Competition

Purpose of the Competition

The Young Horse classes are fundamental to the future of the Sport. The primary objective is to evaluate the potential and correct training, for their age, of young dressage horses – does it have a long term future as a dressage horse?

The Young Horse Tests

First and foremost it is about the horse - the rider is not given special emphasis. The Young Horse tests are not isolated competitions. The 5 and 6 year old tests are the building blocks to higher levels e.g. Prix St Georges. However in the 4 and 5 year old tests there is especially an emphasis on the basic paces.

The Three Most Important Aspects

- The quality of the paces.
- The correctness of training for age level.
- The general impression including the conformation, temperament and the natural talent and ability to perform at a higher level tests.

A young dressage horse has to be attentive by nature (fresh) but nevertheless relaxed mentally. It must be active and engaged but without tension. It must go willingly forward, without any pressure from the rider and should always be focussed on the rider's aids and accepting the contact.

The Judging Sheet

There are 5 marks to allocate:

- 1. Trot
- 2. Walk
- 3. Canter
- 4. Submissiveness
- 5. Perspective

Paces

- Trot: Rhythm, suppleness, elasticity, swinging back, ground cover, willingness to collect (5yr), ability to collect (6yr).
- Walk: Rhythm, relaxation, activity, ground cover.
- Canter: Rhythm, suppleness, elasticity, natural balance, impulsion, willingness to collect (5yr) ability to collect (6Yr), ground cover, uphill tendency.

The difference between "Willingness to collect" (5yr old) and "Ability to collect" (6yr old)

Paces

Be uncompromising – as they are vitally important for the quality of the dressage horse. We want to see regularity and impulsion without tension. Impulsion should be developed from the hindquarters through a swinging back with active hind legs. The steps and strides must be elastic with the horse showing an uphill tendency and freedom of the shoulder.

Quality is assessed by the:

- overall impression,
- the regularity and elasticity of the steps,
- the ability to maintain the same rhythm and natural balance, even after a transition within the paces or from one pace to another.

Walk

Clear regular rhythm. Reach and ground cover. Supple and following the contact.

Trot

For 4yo, these horses are very young so expect variations in the training. A more horizontal frame is acceptable in 4 and 5yos. A 4yo should be loose, no collection yet as it is much too early. However:- natural balance, active hind legs through a swinging back to a steady contact. Trot should be regular, elastic. Should not be on the forehand.

Canter

Active – ground covering. Balanced. Stepping under the body. An uphill way of going. Watch both reins as they could be different.

Negatives in Paces

- No clear rhythm, unlevel steps.
- Uneven and unbalanced, especially in turns and corners tipping forward.
- Not taking weight evenly behind.
- Steps and strides flat and not elevated.
- Back not swinging.
- High hocks.
- Hind legs not stepping under the centre of gravity.
- No freedom of shoulder.
- Exaggerated and forced movement because back is tense.

4yr old Tests

The phase of understanding - correct basic training

Preliminary- Novice level with emphasis on the basic paces. Needs to show the ability to lengthen steps in trot and canter – the beginning of adjustability.

4yr old Minor Mistakes

Should be judged with some leniency, if in principle, the horse is demonstrating good movement and is shown to be presented in accordance with its level of training.

Horses which at the beginning of the test show tension and some concentration lapses or may even be a bit spooky, should be judged more benevolently.

examples

- halt not straight;
- concentration lapses;
- moments of shortness in the neck; or
- being momentarily above the bit.

5 Yr Old Tests

The exercises for a 5 year old are generally of a low level and full collection is not required, rather willingness to collect equivalent roughly to Elementary level. General rideability is more important than formal precision.

Judging the 5yr old

The horse should be listening to the rider, quiet mouth, no swishing tail or teeth grinding. Willingness to collect, short moment of collection may come and go. Balanced in all 3 paces. The impression should be that the horse is carrying himself and the work looks easy.

Must be ridden in a way he can cope with the test. Too much rider created tension is wrong and leads to artificial paces.

Minor Mistakes for the 5 yr old

- Moments of tension at the beginning of the test with slight concentration lapses but improving throughout the test,
- Halt not completely attentive or straight,
- Transitions not exactly at the markers,
- Slight and momentary crookedness,
- Canter wrong lead, but immediately corrected,
- Short break of pace e.g. falling into trot during canter work but immediately corrected,
- Simple change of leg with 2 or 6 steps of clear walk in between instead of 3-5 steps,

Canter

For top marks the canter should be effortless, balanced, relaxed, ground covering and uphill.

Be sure to watch the stretch half circle at trot at the end of the 5 year old test. This is one of the most important movements of the test. Why?

Stretching on a long rein

This is asked for in order to have a final impression about suppleness. Here the Judge can observe whether the horse is swinging in the back, supple/well-balanced, relaxed, obedient, and knows to follow the contact the rider must lengthen the rein and the horse stretches gradually forward/downwards, always maintaining a steady contact with the rider's hands, showing good activity with the hind legs stepping well under the horse's body. During the retake of the reins the horse must accept the shortening of the reins without resistance

6 Yr Old Tests - showing the ability to carry and collect

Equates to a normal dressage level of medium standard. Looking for ability to collect in trot and canter. A higher degree of submission and obedience including simple changes, flying changes, shoulder-in and half passes.

The development of collection leads to - increased engagement of the hind legs, increased lightness of the shoulders to give top marks we are looking for absolute regularity + uphill + freedom of the shoulders. Paces should be elastic with clearly defined transitions. Incorrect training cannot score high marks.

Give and Retake the Reins in Canter

This exercise allows the evaluation of the self carriage of the horse and whether the contact is correct or not. For two or three strides the rider moves both hands forward along the horse's neck, giving up the contact with the horse's mouth. The horse maintains the same position of head and neck.

Minor Mistakes for the 6 Yr Old

- We are not looking for the same accuracy and precision as in normal tests.
- Starting/ending the lateral movement not exactly at the required marker.
- Losing the bend at the end of the lateral movement.
- Flying change not exactly at the required marker.

Submissiveness - The test sheet

- 4YO Contact, Straightness, Obedience, Responsiveness to the aids of the rider;
- 5YO Suppleness, Contact, Straightness, Obedience, Ability to self carry;
- 6YO Suppleness, Contact, Straightness, Obedience, including flying-changes, shoulder-in and half pass.

Submissiveness - What to look for:

- Steady connection not avoiding,
- Watch the poll is not too low with the nose behind vertical,
- Not leaning on the bit,
- Horse trusts the rider, and is concentrating on the riders aids,
- Suppleness shown in 2 track work,
- · He is not avoiding the contact especially in transitions,
- Good rideability and adjustability.

Important

If submission is so bad that it interrupts the pace, it has to be noted and influences the mark in that pace as well. Selfcarriage and appropriate relative elevation are asked for, but each is related to the stage of the horse (4,5,6 year olds) and his level of training. A more horizontal frame is acceptable for the 4 and 5 Yr olds.

How to Evaluate the Flying Changes in the 6 Yr Old

- The flying changes need to be initiated in the correct way from behind and ideally should be well balanced but do not have to be precisely placed.
- Quality of collected canter before and after.
- Straight, uphill and fluent.
- We don't want to see a shorter stride in the change.
- If not achieved then this has an influence on the Submissiveness mark and GI, not in the canter pace.

Perspective

Potential as dressage horse and the standard of training (on the basis of the training scale).

The emphasis here is on

- three correct basic paces with quality,
- the standard of training according to the training scale,
- Potential and suitability as a dressage horse including conformation, temperament and expression,
- Suppleness and the degree of ease with which the horse is able to perform the movements.

A horse which has the potential for high level Sport has to be preferred to a horse that completes the test in an obedient manner but has no real ability to proceed to the higher levels of dressage. Is the horse on the right way? Can it go to higher levels? PSG? BUT Potential CAN NOT compensate for lack of obedience or lack of performance of the special difficulties of the level.

Guide to Marking

9 - 10 = Top Horses, Good training

- 8 = Good Horse, Good training
- 7 = Good Horse, a Few Mistakes
- 6 = Good Horse and Bigger Mistakes or Average Horse

5 and below = Serious Problems or Horse With Barely enough Potential

Guidelines

If one poor pace eg. one you have given below 5.5 then GI cannot be more than 6.5 and most likely less. If generally following scale of training but some small resistances to contact then 6.5 to 7.4.

For 7.5 + must show promise in all 3 paces and generally on right way (4 year old could still be a little unbalanced in the canter).

8+ - shows balance and expression in all paces. Accepting contact and smooth transitions.

Fundamental Training Errors

Will generally lead to lower marks being awarded - examples are:

- No regular correct beat in one or more of the paces obviously unlevel rhythm,
- Tension not swinging in the back,
- Lasting contact failure contact to the mouth is not correct (open mouth, tongue drawn up or hanging out),
- Neck is too high, elevation is not in relation to the bend of the hindquarters – not through,
- Serious crookedness,
- Insufficient engagement of the hind legs Stiff and not engaged hind legs.

How to Judge Young Horse Classes

Can use decimal marks. Keep a running score of each mark for each horse to help you with the ranking for each movement.

Judging Together

Classes should be judged together and normally have either 2 or 3 Judges. Must have a very good writer with dressage knowledge. Where commentary is provided for (and we should do this from State Champs up) need to have one Judge who will be the commentator.

Discuss which pace is the best. Then it is easier to score the rest – are any of the paces the same or lower. For the General Impression mark – is the horse on the right way? Can it go to higher levels? Can it become a Small Tour horse? Remember that the potential of the horse cannot compensate for lack of obedience or lack of performance of the special difficulties of the level.

Summary - Priorities of the Judges

- Absolute regularity of the walk, trot and canter,
- The natural ability of the horse, through its conformation and make up, to engage the hindquarters easily and to be able to "carry itself in an uphill" way of going, with light and mobile shoulders,
- That each of the three paces shows a natural ability to develop collection and extension without any loss of cadence or regularity,
- That as a result of the correct training suppleness, straightness, balance and a confident desire to go forward are clear to see producing light cadenced elastic steps with the horse in a clear self-carriage.






Dressage SA

President's Report

Greetings to all - how quickly the months are flying by.
