Guide to Horse Capacity

In line with the International Animal Welfare Guides, Equestrian Australia has released its Guide to Horse Capacity – Size of Athlete. The Guide recommends that the maximum load a horse is expected to carry should not exceed 20% of the horse's approximate weight. That is, the athlete and equipment should not weigh more than 20% of the horse's approximate weight.

This is a guideline not a rule: it does not prevent person from participating in any equestrian activity. The full Guide can be found on the Equestrian Australia website.

Some extra advice for Dressage judges who wish to re-accredit from April 2022 – March 2025

Your forms were sent by email from Amy McGregor (EA National) on 9/2/22 with a reminder on 9/3/22, which may help if you need to search for them. Or we can send you a copy of the email.

For this cycle from 1/4/2018 – 31/3/2022 the number of competitions to be judged is much lower than usual due to the impact of COVID. Especially as it is by "competitions", so most judges would do at least two classes on one day of judging. If you can't meet your highest level, just list what you have done and let Lesley Sullivan work out what is OK and if extra is needed. She will give judges extra time to meet requirements. She will also send an email with the tasks you still needed to complete.

Note that if you are a Novice Judge your highest level is "Novice". You don't have to have judged the 2C - the 2A or 2B will count. It is the same for all levels.

If you have recently become a Judge or upgraded, the number of events to judge and workshops etc is based on your proportion of the three years' time at that level.

For tracking events, it is a good idea to save emails and/or draws when invited. Save any draw sheets into a folder on your computer. On your i-phone you can search for past competitions in Nominate through the "Results > My Events" icon; if you looked back at a day's results after the event, then that event is automatically saved. If you judged your name will be listed with your classes. For Judges who do everything on their phone perhaps search through the calendar on your phone if you use this as your diary.

Every Judge in SA has done the required Seminars and Workshops – Lesley has kept the JSC up to date with that information from her spreadsheet. We have all the sign-in sheets for JSC events and can help people track their Seminars if they need help with that. The ORBT is fairly long, so plan some quiet time to fill this out. You may need to flick between the ORBT and the Rulebook, so it is easier to do on a computer rather than your phone. You can save and resume at any time. Or you can ask the EA: contact Amy McGregor for a paper copy to be posted to you.

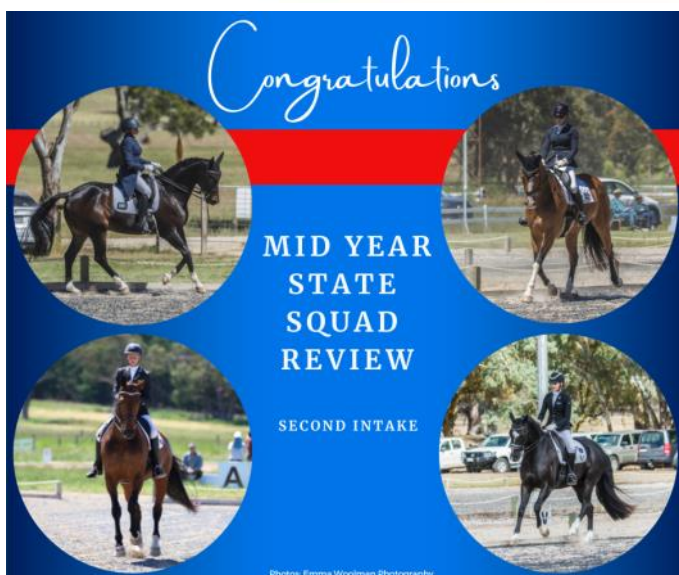

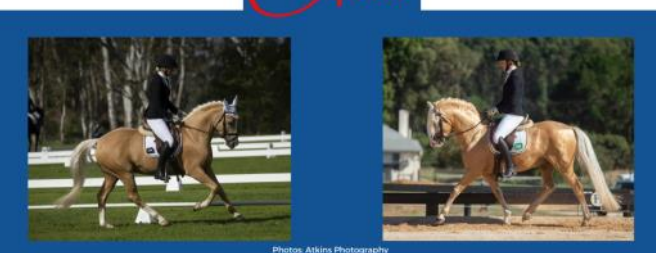

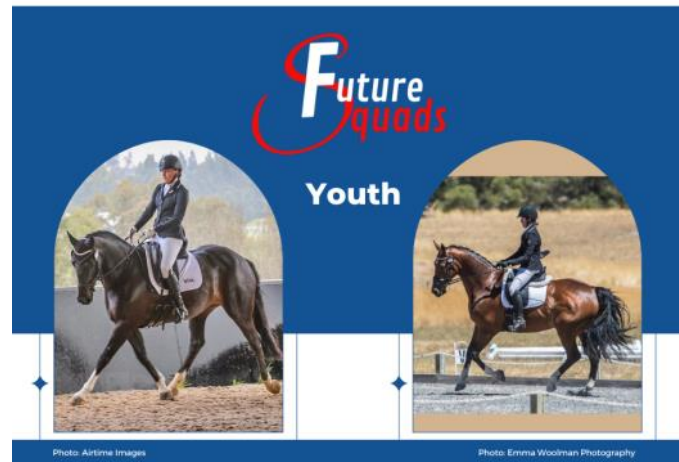

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Did You Know?

Did you know ... with the introduction of some wonderful new facilities in SA, we are seeing more instances where riders cannot practically ride around the outside of the arena before commencing their test. This has been met with confusion by some at times - no, you don't need to squeeze down the indoor wall, or climb up the retaining wall before your test!

If your test is in an arena where it is not practical or safe to ride around the arena, you may start from within the arena. This means, you enter at A once the previous rider leaves - ensuring you give them space and present to the Judge from inside the arena. To begin your test after the bell sounds; simply turn onto the centreline (the same way you would at the conclusion of a test), and off you go!

You can find this information in the Rule Book on Page 35: 3.7 Entering the arena (See Annex D Arena Familiarisation).

"Riders and event organisers must be aware of the following:

- a) when presenting to the Judge before a test, riders do not have to stop and report to the judge but must make sure the Judge has clearly seen their Horse Identification Number
- b) for competitions where it is not practical or safe to ride around the outside of the arena prior to entering, the rider is permitted to enter the arena as soon as the previous rider has exited and before the bell is sounded. After the bell has sounded the new rider starts the test from within the arena
- c) under special circumstances and conditions, the OC may also permit riders to ride within an outdoor arena."

FEI Dressage and what is involved...

The Boneo Summer Dressage Championships in January 2022 marked the first International Dressage event held in Australia for two years due to COVID-19. This was followed by Dressage by the Sea at Willinga Park. It is fantastic to see International competition well and truly back and running in Australia. With the Sydney CDI fast approaching, here is a breakdown of the FEI classes on offer at International events.

Concours de Dressage International (CDI) means the event is run internationally. At these events there are also CDN classes, meaning the event is run nationally.

CDI-Ch (Children)

- * CDI-Ch is open to riders from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 12 to the end of the calendar year in which they reach 14
- * qualifying scores from EA Novice level
- * This level is relatively new to Australian competitions.
- * This will be a class to keep an eye out for as there will be some amazing Young Riders and horses who may will progress through the levels!

CDI-P (Ponies)

- * CDI-P is open to riders from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 12 to the end of the calendar year in which they reach 16
- * qualifying scores from Elementary level
- * Ponies need to have an official EA measurement

CDI-J (Junior)

- * CDI-J is open to riders from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 14 to the end of the calendar year in which they reach 18
- * qualifying scores from EA Medium level

CDI-Y (Young Rider)

- * CDI-Y is open to riders from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 16 to the end of the calendar year in which they reach 21
- * qualifying scores from PSG level

CDI-U25 (Under 25 Grand Prix)

- * CDI-U25 is open to riders from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 16 to the end of the calendar year in which they reach 25
 - * qualifying scores can be from Inter A, Inter B, Inter 2, Grand Prix
- All horses competing in any CDI class require the following:
- * Current EA horse and rider registration

Horse Temperatures

Before the event - As of 1/1/22 all horses competing in a CDI competition must have their temperatures taken twice a day the three days prior to arrival at the venue.

During the event – Temperatures should still be taken twice a day throughout the event until the conclusion of competition.

All temperatures are to be recorded in the “FEI Horse App” available for download from the App Store.

The day prior to competition commencing is the day where the Veterinary Inspection and Fitness Inspection is carried out. All riders must present their horses to the on-site vet for microchip scanning, temperature check and general health check prior to trotting up later in the day. Riders will also hand over their FEI passports at this inspection.

CDI Breakdown for Young Riders

Cont'd

For International competitions the draw won't be finalised until after the trot up - the night before competition.

FEI competition are run in a three day format.

- * Day one consists of the Team Test for P, J and Y and the Inter 2 for U25.
- * Day 2 revolves around the Individual test. This is the test in which riders attempt to qualify for the final day of competition, the freestyle day.
- * Freestyles - CDI-U25 competitors gain freestyle qualification in their Grand Prix. Horses competitions in P, J and Y qualify on Day 2 in the individual tests. The number of entrants or mini % for these riders to be accepted in the freestyle will be specified in the entry schedule.
- * Day 3 the final day of competition, the freestyle day is the day in which the championship is up for grabs. The winner of the freestyle at all levels wins the rug for the class and is the overall champion.

To have the opportunity to compete at a CDI, meet new people and watch some beautiful horses is an absolute privilege and is something I would highly recommend. For those riders heading towards a World Championships or Olympics, the only place for team selection is at CDIs.

Riders are also able to gain qualifications for National Development Squads at CDIs.

There are 5 National Squads in Australia. The squads are as follows:

- * The Senior Squad (min 3 scores in Grand Prix over 68% at a CDI3* or higher)
- * Development A: Emerging Grand Prix/Medium Tour
 - ◇ (GP: Min 3 scores over 67% at CDIs, National or State Champs)
 - ◇ (Med Tour: Min 3 scores over 68% at CDIs, National or State Champs)
- * Development B: Small Tour (PSG, Inter 1)
 - ◇ (Min 3 scores over 68% at CDIs, National or State Champs)
- * Development C: Riders 16-25 years old
 - ◇ Min 3 scores over 64% at U25 Grand Prix or higher at CDIs, National or State Champs
- * Development D: Riders 16-25 years old
 - ◇ Min 3 scores over 65% at FEI Young Rider or higher at CDIs, National or State Champs

Why compete in CDIs?

Firstly, CDIs give riders the opportunity to gain points to go towards FEI world rankings in their respective class. For example, at the upcoming Sydney CDI, Young riders will be able to gain FEI world ranking points. For young riders, CDIs are the perfect opportunity to be exposed to International Level Judges and competitors.

There is tough competition and Judges from all over the world. It is essential to be aware of what competition there is around Australia and how your training program stands up to the International competition. It is very easy to have a shock when heading Interstate due to being unaware of the standard of competition.

Boost Your Competition Confidence

Racing heart ... sweaty palms ... dry mouth ... complete mind blank ... stomach churning ... yep, performance anxiety feels like it hits your body like a bus.

So many riders love riding their tests and furthering their skills with their horse. At home. Riding in front of a Judge, with other competitors watching and that becomes a whole different story!

Did you know, there are some simple changes to your mindset that can flip the effect nerves have on you?

In these two articles, I will share the perspective of nerves from a Neuro Linguistic Programming (NLP) lens and how using effective strategies can improve any performance.



Part 1 will outline the reason behind nerves and why your body reacts like it does. Part 2 dives into strategies to shift you from a nervous wreck to a confident queen.

A survey showed that the majority of people are more fearful of public speaking than death. Wow!

What is it about performing that makes people so nervous? Why do we fear being on stage, in the limelight, in front of an audience, or riding in a white rectangle so much?

Understanding the purpose of nerves is a useful step in reducing and wiping them out.

Our minds have been designed to protect us. We are always interpreting the world around us with what we have internally going on. This internal representation is based on our values, memories, beliefs, attitudes and language. This all goes on at the unconscious level - we couldn't possibly keep up with the processing that is needed every second of the day!

The problem is, this unconscious process might not be doing us the good it thinks it's doing. One of the main jobs of your mind is to keep you safe. It will do this in any way it needs to. This is where fear and anxiety can be explained.

Isn't it crazy; if you organise to skydive, you will feel fear about that jump a day before, an hour before – all in the moments that you are still safe. There's nothing to be fearful of in the day or hour before. And yet, there you are ... not eating, maybe vomiting, maybe shaking with fear.

The way you do anxiety will be based on patterns that you established years ago and now have on repeat.

When we know our patterns, our limiting beliefs, some of the causes to our unconscious actions, we can change them.

How does this apply to performance anxiety?

What we know is that any form of anxiety and fear mean you are focusing on the wrong outcome. People experiencing performance anxiety will be focusing on forgetting the test, their horse playing up, messing up the test ... definitely not the things that make you feel good.

For some of us, we've had experiences of public performance that haven't gone so well. Some of us may have been belittled by coaches, Judges, friends or foes and still have some emotion tied up in that event. Our minds will be holding onto that feeling and wanting to protect us, not wanting to go through that again.

Boost Your Competition Confidence

We might have ramped up this emotion further with the language we've used to describe an event. For instance, if we've had a difficult test where the conditions led to some challenges, we might say things like "I never want to go through that again", "I'd die if that happened again". Our unconscious mind doesn't know the difference between a real command and a joke. If you tell your mind you'd die if that happened again, it will help keep you safe and do everything it can to stop you from performing that same mistake.

Some of the ways of keeping you safe would include reminding you of all the things that you've ever done publicly that you're embarrassed about – have you had that experience? Where you remember an event and cringe at the thought of it?!

Our mind is doing what it thinks it needs to do to stop these things happening again.

Some clients I see are dragging around a heavy load that simply tells them "not good enough" and these 3 words can raise their ugly head in all sorts of situations. There is often an amount of perfectionism that comes with feeling not good enough. That no matter what you do, you never quite feel satisfied with yourself or your performance.

Limiting beliefs and old emotions can do devastating things to your performance. It may take one mistake on one movement; one look from a spectator; one wrong move from your horse ... and you spiral into a negative frame of mind. If you're not careful, this sets you up for negative self-talk before the next test, and the next and so on ...

Combine this limiting beliefs with the language we use and what a cocktail of negativity we have! Cheers! Once swallowed, this cocktail then effects what NLP refer to as our state, or our physiology. Our state can lift you up or send you crashing down – when riding horses ... this is literally!.

We make much different choices when we're in a motivated, excited state compared to a nervous, fearful one. As we know with horses, they respond differently according to what state we are in when we ride.

The good news? Changing our state from nerves to excitement is easy! In the next article I'll share with you some of the fantastic strategies from NLP that can make big changes to how you feel about your dressage test.

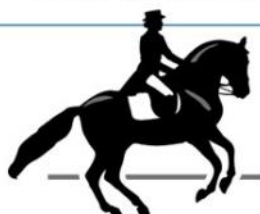

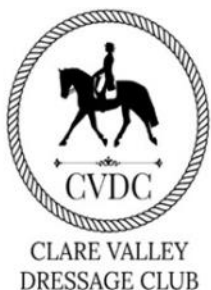

President's Report

Hi all

For Members and Competitors starting out in Dressage Competitions you may not be aware of our Clubs Protocols and Rules so I thought this information may help as listed below:

- * To ride in Competitor classes the horse must be registered with EA, have a current Competition Licence and the rider must be a current financial member of EA.
- * To compete in Participant classes the horse does not need to be registered with EA or have a current Competition Licence but the rider must be a current financial Participant or Competitive member of EA. You may compete up to and including Novice level only in these classes.
- * To Compete in Closed Unrestricted the horse does not need to be registered with EA or have a current Competition Licence but the rider must be a current financial Participant or Competitive member of EA; OR the rider must be a current financial member of our Club for Insurance purposes. (Day Membership can be arranged but only twice in a membership (calendar) year).
- * Usually our Competitive days are January, March, April (Sunday), June, August, October and December.
- * At ALL competitions your horse must have its Bridle Number displayed at all times on both sides of the saddle blanket or bridle when being ridden or on the halter if tied up. This does not apply to horses while they are in stables however.
- * VERY IMPORTANT ALL RIDERS must Gear Check before each test on Competitive days. Failure to do so will incur elimination.
- * Please check in at the desk when you arrive to mark yourself as present. Please notify the Draw secretary by text - Cathy Kluske on 0400 289 481 if you need to scratch.
- * Be aware of current Covid restrictions and rules.
- * Closed Unrestricted competitions – (usually February Combined Training, April -Saturday Protocol day, May Club Champs for Members only, July , September and November). Closed Unrestricted classes are also run on Competitive days. See above for registration and or membership rules.
- * Bridle Number requirements apply as for Competitive competitions.
- * There is NO GEAR CHECK at Closed Unrestricted competitions.
- * Note Changes in dates can occur but the above is mostly applicable.
- * Entries are via '**Nominate**'. Ensure you read and understand the rules and tick the appropriate boxes.
- * Tests may be called except at the Spring Festival in October.
- * Lunging is permitted but not near or in Competition arenas. Keep away from other riders who are warming up. Near the Pony Club area or in the sand enclosure is a good place to lunge.
- * The EA Concussion Rules apply: if the rider has a fall, they must not remount until assessed by the Club's appointed person. If there is any doubt, then they must be cleared by a medical practitioner before continuing.
- * **From July 1st 2022 Helmets must be tagged. This can be done at the ESA office or by arrangement with Sue Brown.**
- * Points accrued for the HOTY, POTY, YOTY awards are from Competitions from November 2021 till September 2022 (for this year) excluding February's Combined Training, April's Saturday Protocol competition and the Spring Festival in October. Full members of our Club only are eligible. Points go on placings 1st to 6th of members only (not including non-member placings).
- * If there is anything you are not sure of please don't hesitate to ask a Committee member.
- * We would like to thank Horseland Mt Barker for their generosity in sponsoring our Club Championships on May 1st providing wonderful prizes and Champion rugs.

Due to the rising cost in fuel etc we have increased the Penciller cash payment to \$50 for a full day of pencilling and hope this will encourage more help in this role. It has become very difficult finding enough helpers each month.

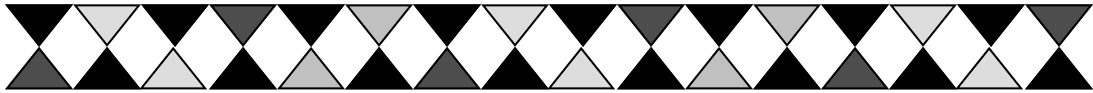

To be fairer to AHDC Members earning points it has been decided to change the points allocation to a "member placing" system rather than the actual placing as a basis of allocating the points. So Non AHDC Members are "excluded" from the placings and points are allocated to AHDC Members only according to their relative placings. Eg. A member places fourth in a competition but will be allocated 6 points as the "first placing" member in a class. This means that riders are able to accumulate more points and riders who would have "placed" 7th or lower in a class will be allocated points as a Member vs Non Member.

Points have been re-allocated from November 2021 so the entire year's placings (from November 2021 to September 2022) will reflect the revised way of allocating of points.

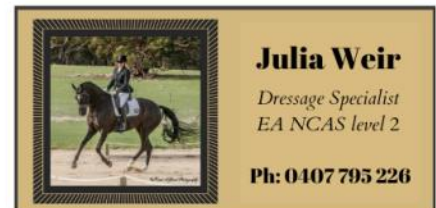
