2023 LINDY WRIGHT MEMORIAL AWARD WINNER - NATASHA COCKBURN

The LWMF Committee is proud to announce that the 2023 recipient of the Lindy Wright Memorial Award is **Natasha Cockburn**. The Award was announced at the presentations for the 2023 Spring Championships on Saturday 8th October.

This award is named in honour of Lindy Wright, a rider remembered as a positive role model and an inspiration for Dressage. The purpose of this Award is to acknowledge those who show the qualities of the "The Quiet Achiever who demonstrates Excellence In Dressage". The winner is selected from nominations sent to the LWMF Committee.

The nomination for Natasha gave details of her history with horses and her achievements:

"Natasha started riding lessons in Tasmania at 7 years old, attended Pony Club and started eventing, competing up to Novice / Intermediate. Natasha then moved to South Australia in 1997 to go to Roseworthy College where she completed a Diploma of Horse Husbandry and Management. She became an Equestrian Australia Qualified coach in 2005. She is well known for her focus on horse welfare, breeding and management. Natasha now works full time as a horse riding coach and trainer based at her property, Oakwood Equestrian Academy, where she currently has around 40 horses of various breeds, ages and disciplines.

Natasha is arguably the best-loved competitor in South Australian Dressage. In the warm-up she greets her fellow riders with her infectious smile and a warm welcome. People instantly feel endeared to her bubbly and positive personality. She will unfailingly wish competitors a heart-felt "good luck" as they prepare for their test. Tash is the person people go to if they need help, and her "eyes on the ground" are hugely sought after and freely given. She recently joined a thriving social riding group with a focus on supporting riders to further their skill and to develop their horses. She also has a strong social media presence promoting the sport in SA, always with a focus on thanking and recognising the important contributions of Clubs and Volunteers.

Natatsha has trained, developed and campaigned her team of horses from breakers to the Young Horse level through to FEI. Specifically, she has trained her OTTB Country Cruizin and WB Coldstream Ulysses through the levels to FEI level. She has a love of producing young horses including her latest home bred, Funomenal. Her philosophy remains firmly ingrained in the training scale principles, always placing the welfare of her horses first.

Tash is a wonderful role model for both her young and not so young students and peers. She has a magnetic and endlessly positive personality that people love to be around. She champions her firm belief that if the horse tries his best, that's all that can be asked, a message that she passes on to her students. Her positivity, hard work and love of the horse make her an inspirational role model. As well as coaching children and teens, Tash is wellknown for her incredible skill in helping adult and nervous riders get back into the horse world after a long absence and helps a number of NDIS funded students to help them achieve their horsey dreams.



With experience in eventing, Tash is able to coach across all Disciplines and is often referred to as the 'second mum' of her teen riders.

As a Volunteer, Tash is a central member of the current DCSA Committee and a former member of Dressage South Australia. She has volunteered to support the Interschool team of Faith Lutheran and Scotch College and also for Mount Pleasant Pony Club."

Thank you Natasha for all your contributions to Dressage in SA.

In reply, Natasha's words:

"This weekend I was incredibly privileged and humbled to have been awarded the Lindy Wright Memorial Award. I have attended this competition for many years and it has always been a pleasure to watch the previous winners be announced. I have long considered this Award to be an incredible honour as it encompasses not only riding, but also the many aspects of horse management and sportsmanship that are so important to our sport. Even though I didn't know Lindy well personally, her memory has always been so well respected and cherished in our community. I would like to thank the Lindy Wright Memorial Foundation, Ned for his generous donation and my dear friends who nominated me. I am beyond humbled and forever grateful to be recognised for this Award."

RIDERS – GET TO KNOW YOUR RULES

THE ONUS IS ON THE RIDERS to know the Rules. As a Committee we will choose a subject to help inform riders on the application of the Rules. **Feel free to request a topic.**

TOPIC: How Many Tests In A Day Can I Ride and What Does Consecutive Levels Mean?

4.8 CONDITIONS OF ENTRY FOR HORSES & PONIES FOR ALL LEVELS OF COMPETITIVE AND PARTICIPATION COMPETITION

- 4.8.1
- (c) horses and ponies competing up to and including Advanced:
 - must only enter and compete in 2 consecutive levels per an event regardless of number of days)
 - can enter and compete in no more than 2 tests in one day. This may include a Freestyle or Young Horse competition
 - no more than 8 tests (EA Levels) over a 7-day period
- d) for horses and ponies competing PSG and above:
 - can enter and compete in no more than 2 FEI-level tests per day and no more than 2 consecutive FEI levels per event. This includes a Freestyle test. If competing in an EA FEI test horses can only compete in one other EA test on the day
 - a horse that has competed PSG may only compete in one Advanced level test on the same day
 - no more than 6 tests (FEI Levels) over a 7-day period.

2023 Dressage Nationals

South Australia had a fantastic week at the 2023 Australian Dressage Championships. There was a great camaraderie between riders, with all SA riders making an effort to help, watch and support one another. We had a total of 14 riders competing across all levels from Novice to Grand Prix, including the Para classes.

As usual we had every season at Boneo; however not as much rain as last year! It was fantastic to watch some of the best riders in the country aim for Olympic qualifications, with New Zealander Melissa Galloway setting a new NZ National record in the Grand Prix Freestyle with a 79.865%! Some lucky SA riders even got some coaching from Melissa across the weekend.

Our SA riders achieved some impressive results, as listed below.

DRESSAGE SA 2024 FOUNDATIONS FOR THE FUTURE SQUAD DOCUMENT

<u>PURPOSE</u>

Dressage South Australia (DSA) is committed to encouraging, training and developing combinations through the levels towards SA's High Performance Squad and National competitions. The purpose of the "Dressage South Australia Foundations for the Future Squad" is to recognise talented combinations within the different categories of DSA riders and create a Squad to develop them. DSA's aim is to encourage Dressage riders to reach their highest potential as they strive for improved performance and better outcomes through training.

BENEFITS FOR SQUAD MEMEBERS

- Will have express entry to on and off-horse training programs.
- Successful Squad applicants will be listed in Moving Forward and on the DSA Facebook page and website.
- Will be provided with a Squad badge.
- May be asked to be demonstration riders for Judges' Clinics and Master Classes.
- Will have access to presale tickets to attend Master Classes as a spectator before opening to the general public.
- Will have the opportunity to attend Judges' update sessions.

HOW TO APPLY

- Applications via Nominate.
- Choose your best three scores from the qualifying period 1st January 2022 to 30th December 2023.
- TWO out of the THREE scores MUST BE FROM SA HOTY COMPS.
- Results must be from Competitive comps with no less than two Judges for each test can be over multiple levels.
- Qualifying scores: Prelim 68% Novice 68% Elementary 67 % Medium 64% Advanced 62%.
- Qualifying scores Para: EA PD Prelim 66% PD Novice 66% PD Elementary 65% FEI PD Novice 65%.

GENERAL QUALIFICATION INFORMATION

- Squad selection will be based on the performance of the rider/horse combination from the preceding twelve months.
- The Squad is open to all Competitive combinations but riders must be current financial members of Equestrian South Australia.
- Should there be more applications than places, an average of the three highest submitted percentages will be used to determine the successful combinations by the selectors. The final average score will be weighted.
- Squad riders are role models for the sport and must abide by the Equestrian Australia Codes of Conduct, Social Media Policy and the Principals for the Welfare of the Horse. This is essential for all positions on the Squads.
- Maximum 24 Squad positions available:
 - o AOR
 - o EA Open (non AOR)
 - o Pony
 - o Youth
 - o Para

Minimum 2 representatives in each category with the next highest performed combinations from any category making up the 24 available positions.

- If there are more applicants than places when comparing scores across levels, the scores will be weighted to provide an equal playing field.
 - o Prelim no weighting
 - o Novice no weighting
 - o Elementary + 1%
 - o Medium + 4%
 - o Advanced + 6%

MEMBERS MUST COMPLETE WITHIN NEXT 12 MONTHS

- Must volunteer at a minimum of ONE South Australian Dressage Club event (Competitive or CUR/Participation) or be an active member of a South Australian Dressage Club Committee or State Dressage Committee.
- Minimum attendance at ONE South Australian Judges' Seminar theory session as an observer or rider each year.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR RIDERS

- 1. Riders need to be current competitive members of ESA and must be based in SA.
- 2. Para Equestrians must also be EA or FEI Classified.
- 3. All owners need to be current members of ESA.
- 4. Horses need to be registered with the EA and micro-chipped.
- 5. Horses must have a current Competition Licence
- 6. Horses must be sound and fit to satisfy competition standards from the beginning of the Squad year.
- 7. Riders must comply with the current Dressage Rules.
- 8. Riders are role models for the sport and must conform to the EA Code of Conduct, Social Media Policy and Welfare of the Horse Policy.
- 9. Poor sportsmanship and inappropriate behaviour by Squad members will not be tolerated. Combinations can be removed from the Squad at the discretion of the DSA Committee at any time if poor sportsmanship or inappropriate behaviour has been verified. Combinations will be formally notified of the decision and reasons will be outlined. Mentoring will be offered if the situation is appropriate with the aim of re-instatement.
- 10. Any rider that has disciplinary proceedings against them enforcing a term of suspension will automatically be removed from the Squad for the remainder of the year.
- 11. If at any time a horse and/or rider become unavailable due to injury or illness for a period in excessive of 3 months, DSA must be advised in writing and they will no longer be part of the Squad.
- 12. At the time of the mid-year review if the competitor has not competed at an EA official competition in the previous 6 months on their selected Squad horse, they will no longer be part of the Squad.
- 13. Where a selected horse is unavailable to attend a clinic due to injury, riders may make a request to DSA to substitute another horse. Each application will be considered on merit.
- 14. Riders may be included on the Squad on more than one horse (subject to the combinations meeting the criteria) but may only register one horse for clinics that are run, unless additional places are available and the organisers choose to offer places to riders with a second Squad horse.
- 15. The senior riders will particularly be seen as role models to younger riders and their behaviour and adherence to the EA Code of Conduct must reflect this.
- 16. The young riders will be seen as role models to their peers and their behaviour and adherence to the EA Code of Conduct must reflect this.
- 17. Riders may be asked to attend DSA events or Judges Clinics as demonstration rider/horse combinations from time to time.
- 18. Riders may be invited to attend user pays training clinics and/or workshops conducted by DSA/DJSC and should make every effort to attend.
- 19. Applications will be open on Nominate with the Squad announced once the selectors have reviewed the applications. Ratified decisions are final.
- 20. DSA reserves the right to review and amend the selection criteria and Squad numbers, as and when, required.

SADA Committee members – SADA President and SADA Vice President

Each edition we will profile a couple of our SADA committee members. In this edition we are featuring our SADA President and Vice President.

Anne Smith - President

Anne spent her formative years on a grazing property named "Biscuit Flat" in the Southeast of South Australia, situated between Kingston SE and Millicent. Although her family was not inherently inclined towards equestrian pursuits, her passion for horses was cemented when she befriended a girl at school whose mother was a chief instructor at Kingston Pony Club.



By the age of nine, Anne had her first free lease pony, a buckskin stock horse x quarter horse named Fleur. The unwavering dedication to this pony convinced her parents this hobby was here to stay, and a series of increasingly more successful horses were to follow. At 14 it was a thoroughbred mare called Holly, later another thoroughbred called Cindy that went on to compete at PSG level. This was around the time when Anne was awarded ESA Dressage Young Rider of the Year. Anne continued to hone her dressage skills while representing South Australia at the National Pony Club Championships and received the Australian Sports Medal in 2000 for her contributions to Pony Club.

Relocating to Adelaide to be with her now husband Adam, Anne took a step back

from competing to pursue a career in coaching, initially in gymnastics and personal training and then later focusing on coaching dressage. Anne was inspired to get back in the competition arena when she fell in love with a horse called Lyric. He was unconventional in his confirmation and despite a vet check that urged Anne "not to touch him with a 20-foot barge pole" she purchased the diamond in the rough and with a high level of commitment and care she transformed Lyric into her successful Grand Prix Mount in just six short years. In 2014 Lyric was names ESA FEI Horse of the Year and even got to compete at the FEI Dressage Challenge at the Adelaide International Horse Trials in 2016.



Anne and husband Adam now reside in Angle Vale with their children Chilli and Lockie. Chilli is following in the equestrian

pathway, already proving herself to be an accomplished young rider with her pony Sheridan Park Gold Star. (Pictured



right)

Also residing on the property is Anne's retired dancing partner Lyrical. Lyrical is considered the "King" and has run of the property. Anne's current horse Shadows Tollinski is working hard to fill Lyric's shoes. Tolly has the X Factor and is the only horse to boast dislodging Anne in the dressage arena. While he has his moments, he is a supermodel with success already in the FEI Small Tour and Grand Prix in their sights.

Anne's next superstar Riddle is waiting in the sidelines for some spare time to begin his climb to the top, and is sure to keep Anne busy with horses to compete with.

Anne also manages Lyrical Acres Agistment and Training in Lewiston. Lyrical Acres is home to many agisted horses and more recently has become the home grounds to SADA. Anne is keen to see SADA grow and hold Official competitions again, while still maintaining the opportunity for grass roots Dressage. From led riders through to the highest levels Anne hopes to see SADA increase membership numbers and become a welcoming home for Dressage riders of all levels.

Jan Boyd – Vice President

Jan Boyd, SADA Vice President, is a recently retired scientist in her mid-70s with a lifelong passion for horses. Her affinity for equines began with early pursuits such as reading, drawing and crafting stories about them. Delving into riding as a young child, Jan's foundational experiences involved learning to rise trot on beach ponies during summer holidays and in her early teens helping break in horses at the local stables with a gang of horse mad kids, all lining up for their turn to be bucked off.



These hardy ponies loved to gallop through the snow, and completed treks through the countryside, carrying little more than a bed-roll and a saddle bag while trekking across the Scottish Borders and staying at local farms as the riders camped at Youth Hostels.

After completing her University studies in Edinburgh, Jan moved to Glasgow for her PhD, then after a break from horses due to work and marriage, a pivotal moment occurred during a week in Spain. As she explored the countryside, galloping in the sun on Andalusian crosses, Jan rekindling her love of riding.

Her equestrian journey continued in Edinburgh, where formal riding lessons became available. Jan, ever enthusiastic, immersed herself in stable duties, horse care and giving riding lessons. Her riding repertoire expanded to include a pelham with double reins, leading other riders on trail rides through the woods and participation in show jumping classes at local Shows. She still has a memento shoe from a hog-maned bay called Viscount that she rode all those years ago.

Upon moving to a cottage near Loch Lomond she discovered The Maple Leaf Ranch. Here her riding style underwent a significant transformation. Jan became accomplished at western riding and was soon taking tourists on trail rides, instructing and caring for 24 horses on the extensive 200 acre property. While working at Maple Leaf Ranch, Jan became a member of the "Running Bears": a group of friendly horse people who came to ride every week.





Jan's equestrian adventures later extended to Australia, where she adapted to riding in a stock saddle on her first ride in the Blue Mountains. On Acquiring her first horse, Diamond Lil, Jan excelled in western equitation and garnered numerous prizes at competitions including the Scottish Championships.



arrival in Adelaide her priority was finding somewhere to ride. She joined a 3-day trail ride from Burra that became a regular long weekend adventure. Before long Jan was making connections in the South Australian Western Community and purchased her first Appaloosa: Ace. Jan immersed herself in the many weekly shows and clinics and saw success with Ace at the Masters Games.



Some of Jan's horses were more suited to forward work and this is where the transition to Dressage began. She rejoined the English riding scene through Pony Club and then it was just a short step to SADA, competing initially up to Novice level.

In recent years, Jan had the opportunity to ride CDS Virtual Ruler, an Australian Champion Appaloosa owned by Pam Buchan. They successfully competed up to Elementary level. However, challenges such as lameness and a sore back led to his retirement.

While Jan has not been riding as much lately, she is still active in all aspects of the horse scene. Over the years Jan has served as Show Secretary for three Western Clubs and previously held the position of Secretary for SADA for an extensive period of time. Jan enjoys the administrative ride of running Clubs and is thrilled to be part of the current SADA Committee during the Club's expansion and development of their home base.

We will continue to feature some more of our Committee members next

year in Moving Forward. If you are at one of our competitions make sure you come up and say hello. We look forward to chatting with you.

We would like to thank the Office of Sport and Recreation once again for their support and also Lyrical Acres for the amazing opportunity they have provided for SADA at their facility. We





HOTY, POTY and YOTY are "AHDC Members only" Awards. Riders must be full financial members of AHDC (Day Members are NOT included) at the time they ride their test to have their points counted.

Points in a class are awarded by filtering out non-members and only looking at AHDC members, who are then ranked into the top six placings. So if a member places 2nd in a class (behind a non-member), they will be awarded 6 points as the AHDC member winner of that class and so on.

1st place - 6 points, 2nd place - 5 points, 3rd place - 4 points, 4th place - 3 points, 5th place - 2 points, 6th place - 1 point.

However from 1 November 2023, if there is only one AHDC member rider in a class, they will only be awarded three points for winning instead of six. For two or more riders it will be 3 points for the Member winner and 2 points for the second placed Member. For three or more Member riders it will be 6 points etc as above. If an AHDC member often gets 6 points by being the only member in a class, that rider has a greater chance of winning than Members riding in classes where there are several Members. This change in points allocation is designed to even up the points allocation.

HOTY points are recorded during the year and include scores over 55% from all of our competitions except (February CT, April Protocol day and October Spring festival). The results are updated on our website so riders can all see where they are standing throughout the year.

The current Round starts with the November 2023 competition.
