







2026 AUSTRALIAN YOUTH DRESSAGE CHAMPIONSHIPS

A small but dedicated group of South Australian youth riders and their families travelled to Werribee Equestrian Centre at the end of January to contest the 2026 Australian Youth Dressage Championships.

True to Werribee form, competitors experienced four seasons in one day, with temperatures ranging from a chilly 9 degrees to a sweltering 45 degrees over the four days. While conditions were challenging, they were a stark contrast to last year's sleet, rain and mud. This year's program also included interschool classes, allowing several riders to reconnect with old friends from the interschool circuit and form new friendships with riders from NSW and Victoria. A Youth Riders Meeting was also held, giving Victorian youth riders the opportunity to provide feedback to Equestrian Australia Victoria, offering an interesting insight for SA riders, into the future of the sport.

The youngest rider in the team, 12-year-old Zara Lally, had a very full competition schedule with her pony Trussana B. Zara placed 4th in all three FEI Children's tests to finish 4th overall in the Children's Championship. She also placed 3rd in the Elementary Pony Championship, with a 5th and 4th in the Elementary tests, and went on to claim Reserve Champion Pony Novice after finishing 6th and 1st in her Novice tests.

Sixteen-year-old Eliza Spiers competed at her first Australian Youth Championships with her home-bred pony Hillswood Beatrice. In the Novice Championship, Eliza placed 6th and equal 7th in her tests before finishing an impressive 3rd in the Novice Freestyle on the final day. Isabelle Finn, riding Danson Der Von Venus and attending her third National Youth Championships, produced consistent performances to place 9th in both Medium tests against strong competition. Cate Rudland brought her young horse Dornfeld River Gem over the border for only their second competition together, finishing 8th in both Preliminary tests in a very competitive class.

South Australia fielded both a composite pony team and an Open Club team, with final scores still pending at the time of print. Throughout the week, the riders were a wonderful support to one another, sharing meals, encouraging each other, and enjoying the camaraderie that comes with youth championships. Between tests, ice boots, misting fans and plenty of frozen slushies helped keep horses comfortable in the heat.


It was a rewarding four days of competition, inspiration and friendship, and the team hopes their experience encourages more South Australian youth riders to join the Championships in 2027. The event offers a supportive environment, high-quality competition and a fantastic opportunity to learn from and connect with talented young riders from across Australia.

UPCOMING EVENTS:

As mentioned in the previous edition of Moving Forward, the JSC will hold an A-B-C Judges seminar on Sunday 1st March with FEI Level 4 judge Maria Schwennesen (Qld) as our educator. The venue for the practical training is Danson Dressage, 59 McLean Road, Birdwood. The night for a ZOOM theory session is still under consideration. For our A/B/C judges, attendance at both sessions will count as a “Seminar”. The event will be open to judges of all levels and not just restricted to A/B/C, and will count as a “Workshop” for judges at other levels. A great opportunity to see our top horses and riders as they give us insight into the training and execution of movements in Advanced (C) level tests and above.

On Saturday 28th February, the DSA committee are holding the 2026 Dressage Spectacular with Young Horse Finals, Freestyle and Para events at Danson Dressage. Maria is a judge at the event and it promises to be a fabulous day for watching talented horses compete.

THE JUDGES' VIEW

We continue a theme started in the December 25 issue of Moving Forward, to help Riders gain more understanding of the “why” behind a score and how it helps as a key to effective training and long-term progression. This edition of Moving Forward has a detailed description of requirements for the Walk, and how marks are assigned (taken from the EA Dressage Rule Book and the FEI Judges Manual). Valuable reading for riders, coaches and judges. Thank you to Brigitte Drinkwater for preparing this review.

IMPORTANCE OF DRESSAGE JUDGES’ COMMENTS.

An important part of the role of the dressage judge is to give comments that align with the marks given for each test movement. In the short time available with each horse and for each movement, the judge has to reach a mark and then very concisely explain reasons for both low and high marks. When time permits the comments may expand to explain how more marks could be gained. The accompanying article and two resources taken from the EA Dressage website provide practical alternatives and phrasing guidance to make every remark both meaningful and actionable. See “The Importance of Dressage Judges’ Comments” and “Phrasing comments on Dressage test sheets” in following pages.



Please make yourself familiar with changes to the rules. A few of the main changes are:

- 1.3.j: It is strictly forbidden to use any type of substance/product inside or around the Horse’s mouth and/or tongue that may (i) imitate, induce or cause foaming; and/or (ii) coat or otherwise cover, or partially cover the bit. The prohibition excludes the use of products permitted in the FEI Tack App and the provision of permitted natural treats given in moderation. Contravening this rule will entail a Yellow Warning Card and Elimination
- 5.5: Spurs - if disc rowels are used, they must be blunt & smooth (no sharp edges) and free to rotate. Daisy rowels, tines, notched, serrated edges are not permitted. Some difference in rules for Ponies-please check.
- 5.8: Jackets - for all EA levels and non-CDI FEI levels, wearing a coat is optional if the rider feels overheated
- Section 12 – changes to the compulsory conditions to maintain accreditation, with more event options for G judges.

ON-LINE “OFFICIAL’S FINDER”

The new JUST.GO platform for EA Officials is now live and judges are reminded that they need to “opt-in” to having their name and contact details available. Click on the EA website “Members Info” button and then the Quick Link to “EA Member’s Portal”. You will need to log-in and then update your information on the “Official Finder” tab. Select the button to agree to appear in the on-line Finder and add which contact information you prefer – email, phone or both. Address can be suburb and postcode to allow location searches by clubs. As a tip, then do an Official search on your own name to check details show as you wish.



IMPORTANCE OF DRESSAGE JUDGES' COMMENTS.

Dressage judges' comments are far more than a formality, they are a vital communication tool that bridges performance and progress. Thoughtfully phrased feedback helps riders understand what was seen in the moment, reinforcing strengths and pinpointing areas for improvement in a way that scores alone cannot convey. At their best, comments are specific, educational, and encouraging: they move beyond generic words like "nice" and instead use clear, descriptive language that reflects the quality of the movement, the accuracy of the aids, and the harmony between horse and rider.

The FEI Dressage Rules and Judging Manual emphasise that judges' remarks are intended for the information of the athlete and should explain the reason for the mark, particularly when scores are lower, while also recognising that comments on higher marks support clear communication and reinforce quality.

For judges, crafting effective comments with well-chosen words builds rider confidence, supports progression and trust in the judging process, while also helping judges maintain clarity, consistency and professionalism across all levels of the sport. The accompanying resources provide practical alternatives and phrasing guidance to make every remark both meaningful and actionable.

Dressage Comments

Below are a few alternative words you could use instead of **Nice** in your Dressage Comments, with examples of how they may replace 'nice'.

- Accurate (acc turns, acc loops, acc figures)
- Assured (assured throughout the test)
- Attentive (attntve in FRW)
- Balanced (eg bal'd trans, bal'd canter etc)
- Bold (bold extnsn, bold entry)
- Calm (calm FRW, calm entry)
- Clear (clr trans, clr change)
- Confident (confidt entry)
- Crisp (crisp depart from halt, crisp to walk)
- Diplomatic (diplm'tc aids, diplomatic riding)
- Direct (direct trans)
- Elastic (elastic paces, elastic contact in the trot)
- Elegant (eleg't entry & halt)
- Flowing (flowing trot work, flowing test)
- Fluent (fluent 1/2 circle & return, fluent on centreline)
- Free (free in shdrs in ext'd walk, free cntr on circle)
- Honest (honest horse, honest attitude)
- In the right direction, going in the right way etc
- Loose (loose paces, loose trot, loose thru back (as opposed to tight thru back))
- Obedient (obed't trans, obed't circle)
- Precise (precise trans, precise halt)
- Prompt (prompt to halt, prompt to cntr at C)
- Relaxed (relxd back, relxd FRW)
- Rhythymical (rhy'l lengthening, rhy'l cntr depart)
- Secure (secure rhythm, secure in walk)
- Smooth (smth halt, smth trans)
- Soft (soft to walk, soft on diag)
- Stable (stable in all his walk & trot work)
- Straight (strt entry, strt on long side)
- Supple (supple loops shown, supple thru ribs on turns at E & B)
- Swinging (swinging back, swinging well in cntr)
- Sympathetic (sympathetic contact, sympath trans)
- Uphill (uphill trans, uphill entry)
- Well-ridden (trans's, loops, trot work, stretch circle)
- Well-executed
- Well shown
- Well-presented
- Well-prepared
- Well-trained
- Willing (willing attitude, willing temperament)

JUDGING THE BASIC PACES OF THE HORSE – THE WALK

Let's start this month with the walk. While it may seem simple, the walk is fundamental to dressage, tested rigorously and often scored with a double coefficient (x 2!!). Riders must master rhythm, relaxation, and clarity in walk variations to score well, while judges need a sharp eye to reward these qualities fairly. Below, we break down the FEI's walk definitions and how the scale of marks, along with the indicators from Stephen Clarke helps translate performance into scores.

The Walk


A 'step' in walk constitutes one step by a foreleg. The walk is a marching pace in a regular and well-marked four (4) time beat with eight (8) different phases. (see *diagram below*) This regularity combined with full relaxation must be maintained throughout all walk movements. There is no moment of suspension. When the foreleg and the hind leg on the same side are moved forwards and set down at the same time (or almost at the same time), this will lead to a serious deterioration of the pace.

The walk tends to become an almost lateral movement, so-called "pacing" or "ambling." (*also identified as lateral or becoming lateral*). The following walk tempi are recognised: Collected walk, Medium walk, Extended walk, and Free walk. There should always be a clear difference in the attitude and over tracking in these variations.

- **Collected Walk:** The horse remains "on the bit," moves resolutely forward with its neck raised and arched, showing a clear self-carriage. The head approaches the vertical position, and a light contact is maintained with the mouth. The hind legs are active and engaged with good hock action. The pace should remain marching and vigorous, the feet being placed in regular sequence. The steps are shorter, higher, and more active than in medium walk, because all joints bend more markedly. Ideally, the hind feet do not track over the footprints of the forefeet.
- **Medium Walk:** A clear, regular walk of moderate lengthening. The horse, remaining "on the bit," walks energetically but relaxed with even and determined steps, the hind feet touching the ground in front of the hoof prints of the forefeet. The athlete maintains a light, soft, and steady contact with the mouth, allowing the natural movement of the horse's head and neck.
- **Extended Walk:** The horse, showing utmost freedom of shoulders, covers as much ground as possible without haste and without losing the regularity of the steps. The hind feet touch the ground clearly in front of the hoof prints of the forefeet. The athlete allows the horse to stretch out head and neck (forwards and downwards) without losing contact with the mouth and control of the poll. The nose must be clearly in front of the vertical.
- **Free Walk:** The free walk is a pace of relaxation in which the horse is allowed complete freedom to lower and stretch out head and neck. The degree of ground cover and length of steps, with the hind feet stepping clearly in front of the footprints of the front feet, are essential to the quality of the free walk.
- **Stretching on the Long Rein:** In order to execute the exercise 'stretching on a long rein' correctly, the rider must allow the horse to gradually take the reins smoothly as the horse stretches his neck forward and downward. The horse's mouth should reach approximately the horizontal line corresponding to the point of the shoulder, while a light, elastic, and consistent contact with the rider's hands is maintained. The horse covers as much ground as possible without haste and without losing the regularity of

his steps, with the hind feet stepping clearly in front of the footprints of the forefeet. During the retake of the reins, the horse must accept the contact without resistance in the jaw, mouth, or poll.



Judging the Walk Using the Scale of Marks

Judges evaluate the quality of the walk by considering rhythm, regularity, relaxation, and the distinct qualities of the walk variations, as outlined by the FEI. Using the scale of marks 0 to 10 alongside indicators documented by Stephen Clarke (see *MF* issue 159), judges are provided a clear framework to translate these observations into numerical scores:

- **10 (Excellent):**
The walk is free, regular, rhythmic, and clearly defined with exceptional activity and ground cover. The horse shows complete relaxation, self-carriage, and obedience, with a swinging back and ideal head and neck carriage. Distinctions between walk tempi are unmistakably clear, with consistent and expressive over-tracking. The movement is exemplary in every respect and could not be improved. It's very special to give a 10 and reserved for something truly outstanding.
- **9 (Very Good):**
The walk shows very clear rhythm and regularity with a high degree of relaxation and activity. Contact is elastic and correct, and the horse clearly differentiates between walk tempi. Any minor imperfections (for example, slight loss of over-tracking or momentary tension) do not detract from the overall quality. A movement of exceptional impression. (goose bump material)
- **8 (Good):**
The walk is regular, clear, and correct, with good relaxation and activity. Differences between walk tempi are visible, though not always fully expressed. Minor tension, reduced ground cover, or small inconsistencies may occur but do not significantly impair the quality. For example, the free walk may be very good, but transitions or accuracy reduce the overall mark.

JUDGING THE BASIC PACES OF THE HORSE – THE WALK

- **7 (Fairly Good):**

The walk is generally regular and correct but lacks expression, energy, or elasticity. Some tension, stiffness, or loss of clarity in rhythm may be evident. Differentiation between walk tempi is limited, and the movement lacks refinement or consistency throughout.

- **6 (Satisfactory):**

The walk meets the minimum requirements but shows clear weaknesses. There may be tension, unevenness, or reduced over-tracking and self-carriage is not consistently maintained. The walk may show tendencies toward lateralisation (pacing or ambling). This mark may also apply to a good-quality walk with a clear error or inaccuracy, such as a well-balanced walk pirouette that is too large.

- **5 (Sufficient):**

The walk movement may have been achieved but without quality, showing irregularity, loss of rhythm, and clear tension or resistance. The steps lack clarity and consistency become lateral, and does not meet the expected criteria for the required walk variation (collected, medium, extended, or free).

- **4–1 (Insufficient to Very Bad):**

Marks below 5 reflect major faults. These may include pronounced irregularity, clear pacing, breaking into another gait, severe tension or resistance, or a significant loss of rhythm and relaxation. The walk no longer fulfills the basic requirements of the gait and the quality of the gait is lost throughout the movement.

- **0 (Not Executed):**

It is very rare to give 0 usually there is some fragment of the movement shown. 0 would only be if the movement is not shown at all. For example, the horse jogs or trots throughout the entire walk movement, showing no recognisable walk steps in any walk variation.

The walk is more than a four-beat gait; it reflects the horse's level of training, suppleness, relaxation, and responsiveness to the rider's aids. From a judge's perspective, the walk provides clear insight into correctness, purity of rhythm, and the effectiveness of the training scale, while for riders it offers a valuable opportunity to demonstrate harmony, accuracy, and correct development. Understanding what judges evaluate, and how the scale of marks translates the quality of the walk into scores, enables riders to train with greater clarity and purpose.

Mastery of the walk, especially with its double coefficient, can make a big difference in competition results.

Equestrian Australia has developed a National Officiating Accreditation Scheme (NOAS) that sets the requirements for becoming a judge.

To become a new judge, applicants must:

- be at least 17 years of age
- be a member of the EA (at least Supporter category)
- complete the G – Level Expression of Interest Form, on page 4 of [How to Become a Dressage Judge \(G-E\) - Jan 2024.pdf](#)
- have some experience as a rider, coach, writer/penciller
- attend an EA approved G, F or G/F level seminar
- have completed the relevant sit-ins, and shadow-judged the required number of tests (more detail is in the workbook)
- have successfully completed the current G Level [Open Rule Book Test](#), and
- complete the Australian Institute of Sport (AIS) Community Officiating Principles Online Course [Essential Skills | Australian Sports Commission](#)


3.7.2 Jackets and coats: To align with new FEI Para Dressage rules (FEI Article 8427.9 – Dress)



A **white coloured** Arm Band, (provided by the athlete) must be worn at all times by athletes with a classified **visual impairment**, while mounted outside of at the competition (Field of Play).



A **light blue coloured** Arm Band, (provided by the athlete) must be worn at all times by athletes with a classified **hearing impairment**, while mounted outside of competition (Field of Play).
Note: recommended for 2026 with implementation for 1st January 2027



A **yellow armband stating 'Trainer'** will be worn whenever trainers are mounted on grade I, II and III para dressage horses.
Note: yellow armband recommended for 2026 with implementation for 1st January 2027

3.14.1 Bridles: Where ladder reins are permitted, there can be a maximum of three soft rungs loops per rein. Where looped reins are permitted, there can be a maximum of four loops per rein. Each loop strap measuring no more than 30cm in length, measured inside of the loops.

4.3.4 Horses and ponies must be at least 6 years old to compete in EA Para Dressage and for Grand Prix tests, the horses must be the minimum age as per the FEI rules.

9.1.3 **Virtus** athletes are allowed callers and commanders as they are considered to be standard aids for Virtus athletes.

9.3 Classification: Virtus classification is managed by Sport Inclusion Australia and must be obtained prior to the closing date of an event.




MARCH 21st Arena Hire and Training Day






