Nature and Scope

The High Performance Dressage Manager is a part time role responsible for jointly leading all aspects of the High Performance Dressage Program relevant to the preparation and performance of the Tokyo Olympic Games and the World Equestrian Games 2022.

The High Performance Dressage Manager shall be jointly responsible for coordinating the High Performance and operational plan for Tokyo 2020 and WEG 2022 in the discipline of Dressage. This will include managing and maintaining key stakeholder relationships.

In the capacity of assisting the Dressage Chef d'Equipe, the High Performance Dressage Manager shall provide support to all identified camps, clinics, events as well as the Daily Training Environment and planning for the identified cohort of horse and athlete combinations.

The role will further collaborate with the Equestrian Australia Dressage Committee (EADC) on specific HP related projects as agreed with the High Performance Director and the EADC Chair.

Accountabilities

- To work with the HPD, other HP staff, the Chef d'Equipe and veterinarians in developing, implementing and monitoring of the relevant cohort of horse and athlete combinations.
- To work with the HPD and National Selection Panel (NSP) in High Performance and delivery of the relevant areas of the High Performance Plan (HPP).
- Oversee the coordination of all aspects of the relevant cohort of horse and athlete combinations competition and training plans including show entry.
- In conjunction with the HPD forge clear and positive relationships with all key stakeholders and partners.
- To liaise with the EADC, Organising Committee's, the FEI and EA to ensure horse and athlete combinations are presented with ample opportunities to obtain COC's and the relevant qualification for Tokyo 2020 and WEG 2021 whilst increasing the pool of available qualifications for Olympic nomination and WEG selection.

- In conjunction with the HPD collaborate on potential Performance Pathways opportunities for the discipline of Dressage.
 - Represent Equestrian Australia (EA) to enhance and strengthen our profile and brand to optimise opportunities for the development and growth of equestrian sport.
