

## Regenerating ESA Driving in South Australia

Many of us who are interested in driving horses have been busy over the past year or so despite the Covid-19 pandemic having touched all our lives. We have been schooling our carriage ponies and larger breeds in anticipation of a return to competition and greater social freedoms afforded by new vaccines. Fortunately, caring for and schooling our horses has kept us focused on the future and how to regenerate people's interests in the elegant and skilful discipline of driving horses.

To help facilitate greater interest in the sport, the ESA Driving Discipline Committee has collaborated with the EA affiliated Angas Harness Driving Club (AHDC) to develop a program of information and instruction covering as many aspects of driving as possible. This two-day event was held in mid-May at Kirkcaldy Park in Meadows, SA, and attracted significant interest from people wanting to try a new horse sport, as well as those already experienced in other equestrian disciplines.

Well recognised as the oldest equestrian sport in the world, and recently having an elevated profile through the passing of former FEI President HRH The Prince Philip, Duke of Edinburgh, carriage driving in SA is ready to attract new interest if indications at our May event are any indication. The program included all aspects of harnessing up and correct fitting of harness and carriage for singles and pairs, with AHDC President Jackie Boyd handling the former, and accomplished pairs driver Kim Branch demonstrating how it's done with larger breeds in pairs harness.
