

### **TERMS & CONDITIONS**

This event will run under EA/FEI rules. The Organising Committee (OC) reserves the right to change or amend the program at their discretion. All owners and competitors will be personally responsible for damages to any third parties caused by themselves, their employees, their agents or their horses. Please ensure the safety of your children whilst in proximity to horses.

- 1. Closing Date of Entries Friday 19th April @ 10pm
- 2. Entries Online via Equipe Opening Monday 1st April
- 3. Equestrian South Australia will conduct the 2024 South Australian State Jumping Championships under the auspices of Equestrian Australia (EA) in strict accordance with FEI and EA National Show Jumping Rules (Effective 1st July 2023, as amended).
- 4. https://www.equestrian.org.au/sites/default/files/EA\_National\_Jumping\_Rules\_CLEAN\_1\_Jul y\_2023.pdf
- 5. The following applies:
- RIDERS taking part in the Event must be financial members of EA. Riders must be competitive members if competing in classes 1.05m. and above. Riders must be minimum Participant members if competing in classes 1.04m and below. All horses must have base registration. If competing in classes 1.05m and above, those horses must have full registration and hold a jumping licence.
- HORSES competing in classes 1.05m and above must be registered with EA, have a current Jumping Competition License (formerly Performance Card) and be owned by a financial member of EA. Proof of Jumping License must be produced upon request.
- 6. Entries MUST have ALL HORSE, RIDER AND OWNER details including EA registration (where applicable) and membership numbers (where applicable). All competitors are strongly encouraged to submit their entries via Equipe and pay fees by direct deposit or credit card.
- 7. Swabbing: Random swabbing will take place. A swabbing fee of \$20.00 per horse must be paid with entries. Please make yourself aware of prohibited substances and the relevant withdrawal period. Check the ingredients of all products you are using including herbal products with your vet. Security and access to the horse is the sole responsibility of the owner/rider.
- 8. The Organising Committee reserves the right at its absolute discretion to alter or amend any part of the program.
- 9. The Organising Committee reserves the right to refuse entry without giving a reason and to ballot horses if necessary.
- 10. Protests are to be submitted in writing to the show committee within 30 minutes of the incident or the announcement of placings and with a fee of \$50.00, to be refunded if protest is upheld.
- 11. Late Entries may be accepted at the discretion of the organising committee and will incur a \$10.00 fee per class. Late entries will start FIRST in the draw.
- 12. Substitution of a nominated horse may take place only within the nominated Classes and must be notified to the Secretary at least two hours prior to the commencement of the Class.
- 13. Jumping horses may be transferred from one class to another, without incurring a late entry fee but additional entry money if appropriate must be paid. This must be done by 8.00am on each day.
- 14. Scratching: 75% of entry fee will be refunded only if Veterinary Certificate or Doctors Certificate is produced within 3 days of the competition. Once an entry is accepted, the Grounds Fee is non-refundable.
- 15. Ground fee of \$10.00 per horse, per day or \$30 per horse per show must be paid with entries
- 16. Juniors: Competitors may take part in competitions for juniors until the end of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 18.
- 17. Horses may only compete in one of the Junior or Senior Championships categories.
- 18. Mini Prix horses may not start in other Title series i.e., Senior or Junior
- 19. Horses may have maximum of 2 starts in one day. The Organising Committee has the right to refuse an entry.
- 20. Dress Code Riders in all competition rings must be in correct dress unless otherwise instructed by the judge. It is compulsory for athletes to wear a tagged and properly fastened helmet whilst mounted. As an exception senior athletes may remove their helmet at the presentation in the competition arena only.
- 21. Stallions The Organising Committee follows the EA stallion code of conduct. Guardians of riders/handlers under 17 years must take responsibility for stallions at all times including when leading, riding or stabling stallions throughout the venue.
- 22. Dogs Dogs must be kept on a leash and under effective control at all times. Dogs are not permitted in warm up or competition areas.
- 23. Prize money will be paid directly into the competitor's nominated bank account within 10 working days of the event. If incorrect bank details are supplied prize money will be forfeited.
- 24. Yards and Camping is all to be booked at time of entries.
- 25. Undercover yards are booked as a block charge. It will cost \$80 for a maximum of 4 nights stay. Due to the short supply of yards they are first in first served and priority is given to interstate and regional competitors. BYO straw. No Straw is provided. No Straw in portable yards. All yards must be cleaned out. All straw and manure can be bagged up for easy disposal. The cost of Camping is \$40 for powered or \$26 unpowered per night.
- 26. Ground fee of \$10 per horse per day is payable at time of entry.
- 27. Medical fee is charged per rider at a cost of \$30. Please be aware the cost of medical staff has increased greatly and this fee is used to ensure we have the right medical staff on site.





### **NOMINATION & SCORING CONDITIONS**

#### Nomination Conditions for Junior, Young Rider and Senior classes:

Competitors whose age allows them to compete in different divisions may do so but only if on different horses.

**Junior:** Athletes can take part in Competitions for Juniors until the end of the calendar year, in which they reach the age of 18 years. Athletes may take part in open Competitions 1.20m and above from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 12 years.

**Young Rider:** Athletes can take part in Competitions for Young Riders from the calendar year in which they turn 16 years old until the end of the calendar year, in which they reach the age of 21 years.

Senior Rider: Athletes are eligible to compete from the beginning of the calendar year in which they turn 18 years

#### Scoring Conditions for Junior, Young Rider & Senior Championships:

Scoring for the above classes will be as below. The idea behind this is to award the "most consistent" horse in the above classes to determine the STATE TITLES HOLDER. However, each class will also be treated as "standalone"

All Classes will have prize money paid out as nominated further in schedule for actual class placings PLUS the Winner of each Title will receive a trophy rug.

Scoring will be done over 3 rounds to determine the Champion. To be eligible for the Championship horse/rider combinations must compete in all 3 rounds.

**Round 1** will be scored by total number of starts. i.e. if 30 horses start class then first place will receive 30 plus 1 point. 2nd place will receive 29 points, 3rd place will receive 28 points and so on down to last place who shall receive 1 point. Horses eliminated will receive 0 points.

**Round 2** will regardless of numbers of horses starting use the same number from round 1 and the same scoring system, Round 1 and Round 2 will then be added together for a leader board.

**Round 3** - the FINAL draw will be in reverse order of points thus far. Round 3 will be scored the same way as Round 1 and Round 2. The combination with the most points over the 3 days will determine the State Champion.

If competitors are tied for first place after the three final competitions, there will be a jump-off against the clock over a reduced course of at least six obstacles. In case of equality of penalties and time in this jump-off a second jump-off, against the clock, will be held over the same course. Competitors not in the jump-off but tying on penalties are placed equal.

Each Class / Round will be an individual standalone class.

#### Nomination conditions for Mini Prix series:

Horses starting in the Mini Prix series may not start in any title class i.e Junior, Young Rider and Senior Championship categories but may start in height classes should horse welfare allow.

Starting Height: approx. 1.30m first round

#### Nomination conditions for Best Performed Eventing Combination in both Arenas:

A trophy rug will be presented to the best performed Eventing combination.. The rugs are kindly donated by Susie Verco. You must select that you qualify as an Eventing combination when entering to be in the running for this prize. The winner will be the combination with the most points. Points will be calculated on the following format. 5 points for 1st, 4 points for 2nd, 3 points for 3rd, 2 points for 4th and 1 point for 5th. A further 1 point is given for each clear round over the duration of the 3 days. In the case of equal placings the combination competing at the higher level will win. To be eligible horses need to have completed 2 ESA events in the last 12 months.

#### Nomination and scoring conditions for Thorough Care Best Performed Thoroughbred:

This is open to Thoroughbreds that are 4 years old and over, have officially raced or trialed either locally, nationally or internationally and who are registered with the RISA (Racing Information Services Australia). Registrations will be checked by the Organising Committee and provided to Thorough Care. Racing Name and microchip number must be supplied at time of entry. There is no limit to how long they have been out of racing.

The winner will be the combination with the most points. Points will be calculated on the following format. 5 points for 1st, 4 points for 2nd, 3 points for 3rd, 2 points for 4th and 1 point for 5th. A further 1 point is given for each clear round over the duration of the 3 days.

In the case of equal placings the combination competing at the higher level will win.





### **NOMINATION & SCORING CONDITIONS cont...**

#### Nomination and scoring conditions for Open Height Series classes:

The five series height classes (70cm, 80cm, 90cm, 1m, 1.10m and 1.2m) will run each day over the 3 days commencing Friday of the show. Points will be allocated for horses competing in each round including round 3. All rounds will be placed as standalone classes. At the completion of Round 3 the CHAMPION will be named overall in the class.

This CHAMPION will be determined from the combination that carries the highest number of points from all 3 events. i.e. round 1, round 2 and round 3.

CHAMPIONS in each height will receive a trophy rug and sash. Horse and rider combinations may compete in 2 heights if scheduling allows remembering horses MAY not compete in more than 3 classes at the show each day. Points will be scored by total number of starts. i.e. if 30 horses start class then first place will receive 30 plus 1 point. 2nd place will receive 29 points, 3rd place will receive 28 points and so on down to last place who shall receive 1 point. Horses eliminated will receive 0 points. This will occur for each round with the last round also collecting points .

Riders may enter individual classes or all three in the series. Only those entered in all three classes will be eligible for the series.

\*\*NOTE: When entering a series via Nominate, please select all 3 classes in that series to enable bulk discount.

#### Nomination conditions for Best Performed Horses in Both Arenas:

A trophy rug will be presented to the best performed horse in both Arenas. The rugs are kindly donated by Susie Verco.

The winner will be the combination with the most points. Points will be calculated on the following format. 5 points for 1st, 4 points for 2nd, 3 points for 3rd, 2 points for 4th and 1 point for 5th. A further 1 point is given for each clear round over the duration of the 3 days. In the case of equal placings the combination competing at the higher level will win.

- 2. To be eligible to participate in this event you must be a current ESA member or current member of an EA state branch. You must also satisfy any further membership or registration requirement (including those for any horse entered) referred to in the General Conditions of Entry for the event (Conditions of Entry) and individual disciplines.
- 3. The EA National Sports Rules applicable to the event are referred to in the Conditions of Entry.
- 4. All EA and ESA events are subject to the EA Code of Conduct (Code of Conduct). The Code of Conduct can be accessed on the EA website via the following link

- 5. It is important that all members understand that the Code of Conduct also covers parents, guardians and spectators in respect of any activity held or sanctioned by ESA or an EA state branch. A key aim of the Code of Conduct is to respect the rights of everyone involved, to abide by all EA rules and requirements, to be fair, considerate, honest and professional in all aspects of the sport.
- 6. EA and ESA are committed to the protection and welfare of its members. The EA Member Protection Policy (MPP) can be accessed on its website via the following link

- 7. These are important documents designed to ensure the safe and fair conduct of the event for everyone involved. They should be read, understood and complied with.
- 8. EA and ESA events are also subject to various codes and regulations designed to protect the horse, the welfare of which is paramount (Horse Welfare Provisions). Entrants and Competitors must familiarise themselves with the Horse Welfare Provisions and ensure that they are complied with. - 9. Entrants and Competitors must familiarise themselves with the provisions of the EA documents referred to above (EA documents) and ensure that they comply with them.
- 10. By submitting an entry for the event you agree to comply with and be bound by the provisions of the EA documents, these Special Conditions and the Conditions of Entry.
- 11. If you are the parent or guardian of a participant or competitor under the age of 18 years, by submitting an entry for the event you consent to their participation in the event and undertake to the best of your ability to ensure that they understand and comply with the provisions of the EA documents, these Special Conditions and The Conditions of Entry.
- 12. If there is any conflict in the interpretation between the provisions of the General Regulations and any of the EA documents, these Special Conditions or the Conditions of Entry, the General Regulations will take precedence. If there is any conflict in the interpretation between the provisions of these Special Conditions and the Conditions of Entry, the Special Conditions will take precedence.
- 13. The Organising Committee for the event is referred to in the Conditions of Entry. The Organising Committee may at its absolute discretion, decline to receive any entry or return any fee without being liable for any compensation: General Regulation, Article 116.11. The Organising Committee's decision in relation to any entry for the event shall be final and binding.

#### **Cancellation and Refund**

- 1. ESA or the Organising Committee may cancel the event due to catastrophic conditions, disease or force majeure, or for any other reason at its absolute discretion.
- 2. If the event is cancelled after it has commenced there will be no refunds. If the event is cancelled prior to commencement the entrant may be entitled to a proportional refund of the entry fees paid. Any such refund will be determined at the absolute discretion of ESA, having regard to the direct or fixed costs for the event.
- 3. Entrants who have provided with their entry an email address and/or mobile phone number will be notified of event cancellation by email and/or text message.
- 4. The refund policy for withdrawal, scratching or change of an entry is set out in the Conditions of Entry.

#### Release and Indemnity

- 1. You acknowledge that horse riding, working with or being around horses can be dangerous. Horses can act in sudden and unpredictable ways, especially if frightened or hurt. As a consequence, there is a real risk of damage to property, serious injury or even death. In consideration of acceptance of your entry and participation in the event you agree to release and forever discharge EA, ESA, their servants and agents and the Organising Committee and each member thereof from all claims, proceedings or demands for any loss or damage howsoever arising from any accident or incident occurring at the event.
- 2. In consideration of acceptance of your entry and participation in the event, you agree to indemnify and keep indemnified EA, ESA, their servants and agents and the Organising Committee and each member thereof against all claims, proceedings or demands brought by or on behalf of any participant or competitor named in your entry form for any loss or damage howsoever arising from any accident or incident occurring at the event.





#### **HORSE WELFARE & RISK MANAGEMENT**

#### Welfare of the Horse

In all equestrian sports the horse must bec onsidered paramount.

The well being of the horse shall be taken above the demands of the breeders, trainers, riders, owners,dealers, organisers, sponsors or officials.

All handling and veterinary treatment must ensure the health and welfare of the horse.

The highest standards of nutrition, health, sanitation and safety shall be encouraged and maintained at all times. Adequate provision must be made for ventilation, feeding, watering and maintaining a healthy environment during transportation. Emphasis should be placed on increasing education in training and equestrian practices and on promoting scientific studies in equine health.

In the interests of the horse, the fitness and competence of the rider shall be regarded as essential.

All riding and training methods must take account of the horse as a living entity and must not include any technique considered by the FEI/EA to be abusive.

The national and international Rules and Regulations in equestrian sport regarding the health and welfare of the horse must be adhered to not only during the national and international events, but also in the training.

Competition Rules and Regulations shall be continually reviewed to ensure such welfare.

#### **Mount Pleasant Show Grounds Risk Management**

It is a privilege that you are allowed to bring your dog to this venue. We insist you keep your dog under effective control at all times.

Approved and tagged Safety Helmets must be worn at all times when riding. Riding of horses bareback is prohibited. Riding of rugged and/or unbridled horses is prohibited.

Stallions must have an adult handler in the vicinity at all times Horses are not permitted near pedestrian doorways. Bicycles are not permitted near doors designated as public entrances or exits. Speed limits must be adhered to at all times, the speed limit is 10km p/h Power leads must not be on the ground or over roadways. Construction of portable/tape yards is prohibited. Please observe all signs at the venue.

Horses must be tied in a safe manner. Horses must not be tied to unattached floats, wheelie bins etc. No infrastructure to be erected on Grounds without written approval by management prior to event. The Premises be left in a clean, undamaged state. Should this not occur, additional cleaning costs will be charged accordingly.

Noise level to be controlled and excessive noise prohibited. Music must be kept to a level that avoids disruption to nearby residential areas.

No smoking is allowed in Undercover Yards or any building.

Report to ORGANISING COMMITTEE any hazard or incidents involving a person or property damage as soon as possible.

No Straw to be used in portable yards.

All manure must be bagged up. Fees will be charged for anyone not cleaning up after their horses.
