 Open to vaulters in Novice & below. 1 minute freestyle in walk. Worth 0.5 horse points. Will be run after all individual classes to be fair for all competitors.

#### **State Championship Awards**

Only ESA Members and horses owned by ESA members are eligible for State Championship Awards

- Championship Male Vaulter highest placed male in highest individual class
- Championship Female Vaulter highest placed female in highest individual class
- Championship Pas de Deux highest placed Pas de Deux in highest competitor pas de deux class
- Championship Squad highest placed Squad in highest competitor squad class
- Participant Horse highest average participant horse over the competition
- Competitor Horse highest average competitor horse over the competition

#### **Presentation of Awards**

Presentation of class placings and State Championship Awards will be at the Presentation Ceremony at the end of the competition. Club tracksuits or suitable attire is required for all presentations. Lungers must also be present.

Please read the conditions for submitting music carefully. Music not submitted correctly will not be accepted.

## **Conditions of Entry**

## The 2019 South Australian Vaulting Championships will be conducted in strict accordance with the current edition (including amendments) of:

• EA Vaulting Rules (with subsequent amendments), EA General Regulations

The EA Vaulting rules may be downloaded from the EA website <u>www.equestrian.org.au</u>

• Competitors are advised to be aware of the Rules. The onus is on the competitors to know the rules under which they compete

#### Membership, Horse Registration

- All vaulters and lungers must be members of EA those competing at Preliminary/Pre-Novice must hold participant level membership, those competing at Novice and above must hold competitor level membership.
- All horses competing at the competition must be registered with EA.
- Original membership papers must be brought to the competition and be able to be produced at any time during the event.

#### **Entries & Eligibility**

- Vaulters are eligible to compete in one of each of the following:
  - a) Individual Horse
  - b) Pas de Deux Horse
  - c) Squad Horse
  - d) Individual Barrel
  - e) Pas de Deux Barrel
  - f) Squad Barrel
  - HC Entries will be accepted
  - New Pas de Deux combinations are encouraged to start in the level best suited to their ability
  - Vaulting is an inclusive sport and athletes with a disability are encouraged to compete in the class that they feel most comfortable
  - AWD classes are for vaulters with a disability; Integrated Pas de Deux must have at least one vaulter with a disability
    - The organising committee reserves the right to split classes that have a large number of entries.
- Horse points: as per the EA Vaulting rules

#### Withdrawals & Refunds

 Refunds will only be considered after the close of entries, with presentation of a Doctor's and/or Veterinarian's certificate, at the discretion of the Organising Committee. An administration fee may be retained by the Organising Committee. No refund on stables/yards after one week prior to the event.

#### **Horse Swabbing**

- Vaulters and Lungers refer to the current EA Australian Anti-Doping Policy.
- Horses refer to the current EA Equine Anti-Doping and Controlled Medication Regulations.
- Drug testing and swabbing It is compulsory that swabbing is carried out on horses for State Championships by a qualified veterinary surgeon: Refer EA National Medication Control System at <u>www.equestrian.org.au</u>
- Swabbing will be conducted under direction of the swabbing steward.

#### **Helpers Levy**

In order to run competitions we require volunteers to help out in the lead up to and on the day of competition. In the past we have asked for volunteers, however, due to lack of volunteers we are now enforcing a rule for all South Australian competitors.

Every competitor must nominate 1 person who is able to help for half of the day of competition. If you are unable to provide a helper then a **helpers levy of \$15** will need to be paid. Competitors are able to be nominated as a helper if they are competing in only 1 horse class.

Each helper can only be nominated by 1 competitor. If the helper you nominate has already been nominated by another competitor then your nomination will not be accepted and you will be emailed to notify you of this. You can then either nominate another person or pay the helpers levy.

A jobs roster will be sent out before the competition day.



#### Music - Please note the following with care

All music for running in/out, compulsories and freestyles is to be submitted **no later than** Wednesday 28<sup>th</sup> August.

Please read the following information about how to submit music carefully:

1. There is only <u>one</u> way of **submitting music**:



- a. All clubs / competitors must use Dropbox <u>www.dropbox.com</u> to submit their music. An invitation to a Dropbox folder will be sent to each club. All music must be uploaded into this folder in the appropriate format and named correctly (see below).
- b. CDs/USBs will NOT be accepted. Alternative arrangements will only be made in exceptional circumstances.
- 2. Each file must be clearly **labelled as follows**:
  - a. for individual competitors as follows... "Vaulters Name, Event, Compulsories/Freestyle, Class" eg "John Smith, Adv Ind, Compulsories, Class 2"
  - b. where the club uses compulsory music is the same for everyone as follows AGVC Preliminary compulsories. This will be similar for the run in music also.

#### Music not labelled correctly will not be accepted

- 3. Music must be submitted in MP3 format. Music not submitted in this format will not be accepted.
- 4. A **final check** to ensure all the music has been received cannot be done until the final Order of Go has been distributed. Clubs / individuals are responsible for keeping their own list of what music they need and what has been sent through.
- 5. It is essential that all clubs / individuals **bring a copy** of all music on a flash drive to the competition in case a file has been mislaid or corrupted during the sending process.
- 6. Any music that is not accounted for will be replaced by a random piece of music on the day of competition.

### **Code of Conduct**

- Competitors and Officials must observe the EA Code of Conduct
- Competition etiquette should be observed at all times.
- Officials/coaches/lungers/spectators need to have their mobiles set to silent mode.
- Children must be under the supervision of a parent or responsible adult at all times. If this person leaves the grounds, alternative supervision must be arranged.
- All clubs are responsible for ensuring that the property of Northern Equestrian Centre and of other participants at the venue is respected and are liable for any damage caused.
- Competitors must comply with any instruction given by officials at the event.
- Unsportsmanlike behaviour of any sort will not be tolerated from competitors/officials or their connections.
- All rubbish is to be placed in bins.
- No hoof-black on concrete paths/walkways/wash bay.
- All manure must be picked up. This includes indoor arena, outdoor arena, car park, wash bay, etc.
- Manure from day yards is to be placed in a pile in front of yards.

Horse Familiarisation: Roster to be prepared after entries received.

Grading/Raking the arena: Roster for grading will be prepared with Order of Go.

**Arm Numbers:** Squads are to supply their own numbers. Numbers for individuals will be available for collection by the Group/Club/Team's Chef d'Equipe prior to the commencement of the competition.

Order of Go: Will be sent out at least 1 week prior to the competition

#### Stabling:

Over-night stabling is available for those who want it. Cost \$45 per night. Includes some sawdust bedding. Over-night yards are also available. Cost \$15 per night.

#### Camping

Camping sites are available at Northern Equestrian Centre. Cost \$20 per night.
